Area Attraction Things to Do and See



The South Texas Botanical Gardens & Nature Center is a nonprofit, 180-acre botanical garden and nature center located at 8545 South Staples, Corpus Christi, Texas. It is open daily. Major exhibits include an arid garden; Exhibit House with bromeliads, cycads, cacti, and succulents; hibiscus garden; hummingbird garden; landscape demonstration beds; orchid house with more than 3000 orchids; a major collection of more than 100 plumeria varieties; contemporary rose garden with a large pavilion; sensory garden; and water garden. The site also contains a mesquite nature trail through 30 acres of brush. It features some 35 species of woody trees and shrubs, herbs, grasses, and cacti, as well as white-tailed deer, collared peccaries, and coyotes.



The Texas State Aquarium is a nonprofit aquarium located in Corpus Christi, Texas. It is dedicated to promoting environmental conservation and rehabilitation of the wildlife of the Gulf of Mexico. It has been accredited by the Association of Zoos and Aquariums since 1995. It is the largest aquarium in Texas and one of the largest aquariums in the United States.



Art Museum of South Texas

The Art Museum of South Texas is celebrating 50 years on the Corpus Christi Bay. The original complex, designed by world-renowned architect Philip Johnson, opened to the public in October of 1972. To honor our past, celebrate our present, and plan for our future, we have created an exciting selection of exhibitions and educational programs. We are honored to serve as THE fine arts institution for the Coast Bend region. Welcoming over 100,00 visitors annually, we strive to provide a unique selection of cultural offerings for our guests.

HERITAGE PARK

Heritage Park is Corpus Christi's historic park which hosts and supports many art and cultural activities, as well as a variety of community events throughout the year. Come and step back in time at this historic cultural center where several Victorian-style homes now stand.




2026 REUNION LUNCHEON AND MEMORIAL SERVICE NOTES:

Jesus will Meet You where You are.....

As I thought about what to share with each of you today, I thought of sharing some thoughts from the book of Peter. He shared with us many rich words of wisdom; however, he also challenged us to gird or guard our mindset. Whenever you want to share God's word, we want to ensure we are sharing what the Lord wants us to share not what we feel should be shared. In doing what the Lord has called us to do, the results would be a blessing for the ones hearing God's Word as well as the ones sharing God's Word.

In the book of St. John around the fourth chapter, there is a story told to us by the writer of John. We are told in the 4th verse that Jesus himself must need to go through Samaria. The "need," was placed in this particular sentence for two reasons. First, it was three days closer to His destination; second, to obey divine orders so we could have this story to share.

We now come to the 5th verse where Jesus enters the city of Samaria, however, this particular area is called Sychar or **Suchar** which means falsehood and drunkenness as a name of reproach. Genesis 33:19 gives us the background of what took place in that area many years before. I want to encourage you to read the story.

The 6th verse gives us to know that Jesus, being weary from His journey, sits on the well. He is sitting there because He is weary, but he also has a divine appointment with the lady that is coming to get water. Remember He shared that it was needful for him to go to Samaria and needful for Him to be at this well waiting on this particular woman at the time she would arrive to get water. The whole story is remarkable and it teaches us something. First, it shares with us that Christ will meet you where you are in life. He knows what you are going through. He knows what your fears are and why you are not sleeping well at night. Second, not only will He meet you he will heal you. He will heal your brokenness; He will heal your yesterdays and your tomorrows. He will heal broken relationships as well as broken promises. Understanding that He promised never to leave you nor forsake you. We all need someone in our corner, we all need someone to love us for who we are and what we are. We all need to pray. And it is so easy to say "Lord, I am having some things going on in my life that I just don't know what to do. Can you help me through this, can you give me directions, can you comfort me and make me the man or woman you created me to be? I believe that you can, and I believe you will. Also, Lord while I have your attention deliver me from me. Give me to serve you with a pure heart, and for these hiccups that keep disrupting my life, give me what to do to get rid of the hiccups. In Jesus' Name, I pray, Amen."

I believe this letter was written for someone who has questions, be of good cheer the Lord hears your prayer.


