Will your child be turning 11 soon?

Recent changes have been made to the Arizona Immunization Law. Students are now required to have their Tdap and Meningitis vaccines when they actually turn 11 years old, even if they are not in the 6th grade as was previously required. Students must be in compliance with this law in order to attend school. Vaccinations can be obtained free-of-charge at the Maricopa County West Valley Immunization Clinic (623-474-2290).

Why can't I give your child Tylenol or Ibuprofen?

State law and school district policy strictly regulate how medications are to be given at school. Two conditions must be met before over-the-counter medications may be administered at school:

- 1. A parent or guardian must provide the medication. The school nurse is not permitted to dispense medication that is not provided by the parent or guardian. If you foresee that your child may need an over-the-counter medication sometime during the school year, please provide it in the original container. It will be kept in the nurse's office and given only to your child as needed.
- 2. A consent form must be completed and signed by the parent or guardian. Forms are available in the nurse's office.

What about prescription medications?

New this year – if you want a prescription medication to be administered to your child, a Medical Authorization form must be completed by your child's physician. This is in addition to the medication consent form that you complete.

Parents must sign in at the front office **and show ID** before entering campus at any time. This includes before school.

VISITING

Parents are encouraged to visit the school. All visitors to the school must report to the school office upon arrival including **before and after school**. **Picture ID is required**. You must sign in and show ID to receive a visitor's badge. For those who wish to visit a classroom during the school day, it is expected that the teacher and the principal be contacted in advance to arrange a day and time for such visit to avoid any conflicts with the school schedule.



The procedure to not allow pre-school children on the school campus for parties has been in place for some years.

Whether pre-school children or siblings attend class parties is a school decision until a districtwide procedure is developed. Highland Lakes does not allow pre-school children or siblings to attend class parties.

School Function

A 'School Function' is defined as being an activity to which all parents are invited. Location of the function is anywhere on or off your campus. If all parents are invited to the special event, siblings are also allowed to attend school special events (concerts, spelling bees, plays, kindergarten end of year graduations, etc.). The siblings must be under the direct supervision of a parent/ guardian during their visit to the school campus.

PARENTS & Siblings ON CAMPUS

- Parents who walk their children to the classroom before school must sign-in in the front office and show ID.
- Parents may eat lunch with their children in the cafeteria after signing in and showing ID.
- Pre-school children may accompany parents to lunch in the cafeteria.
- Parents are not allowed on the playground.

Volunteering

Parents who volunteer on a regular or reoccurring basis will need to attend a basic volunteer training. Trainings last approximately 30 minutes and you will receive all necessary volunteer materials.

Overnight field trip chaperones must be fingerprinted. You MUST attend a training PRIOR to being fingerprinted. Fingerprints take 8 weeks for results to be returned to us; allow plenty of time for this to be done.

CUTS Program: (<u>Court Unified Truancy Suppression</u>)

To encourage and improve school attendance, Deer Valley Unified School District has implemented a truancy program in partnership with Maricopa County Juvenile Court. Highland Lakes will be tracking attendance very closely. Your child is expected to be at school every day, unless there is an excused reason not to be. A student that is absent more than ten percent (18 days) of the required number of school days per year is considered to have "excessive absences" whether the absence is excused or unexcused. If a student should start a pattern of excessive absences, you will be contacted by letter or phone. The education of your child is extremely important to us. This program is another way of working with the community to ensure a quality education for all students. If you have any questions or concerns, please feel free to contact the front office at 623-376-4300

SIGNING OUT

To ensure that our academic time is respected, we are asking that parents <u>do not sign out</u> their children between 3:15 and 3:30. Fifteen minutes a day, added up over a month represents almost a full day of classes missed.

We hope you are enjoying your summer and are finding ways to stay out of the heat. As many of you are planners, we wanted to make sure you have had an opportunity to see next year's school calendar, which is available on our district's website at https://www.dvusd.org. The calendar can be found under the "Our District" tab.

Throughout the school year, elementary schools, middle schools, and high schools will dismiss early for *Professional Learning Community* time. Professional Learning Communities, or PLCs, are school improvement models aimed at improving student learning for each individual student. Early release days provide consistent professional development so that our teachers have time to work with their peers and focus on best practices for student achievement.

For your quick reference, the early release days for the 2019-20 school year are:

1st Semester August 16, 23, & 30 September, 13, 20, 27 October 11, 25 November 1, 8, & 22 December 6, 13 2nd Semester January 10, 17, & 31 February 7, 14, & 28 March 6, 13, 27 May 8, 15 ✓ No early release days in April due to State Testing.

On the above early release days, school will end 90 minutes earlier than our usual end time. That early release time will be **2:00pm for Highland Lakes**. For families who need before or after-school programs, whether it be for just an early release day or for the entire school year, Before and After School programs are available. Information can be found on the district's website at <u>https://www.dvusd.org</u> under the "Parents & Students" tab then "Community Education".

There are no adults to supervise students after school ends. Unless they are remaining on campus to attend a before/after-school program, all students must be picked up by 2:00pm. Buses run exactly 90 minutes earlier every early release Friday afternoon. You will find the Start and Dismiss schedule on the District Website under the "Parents & Students" tab then "Early Release Times ".

Thank you and we look forward to seeing our classrooms filled with students on August 7 at 8:30am.
