Kindergarten News

In science, students have also been learning about the water cycle and

In math Kindergarten is beginning to learn about money and how much each coin is worth and how to count money. Science- Since getting a back from break the students started a unit on the solar system. They so far learned about the reason for the seasons and the phases of the moon. Next, they will compare and contrast the different planets in the solar system.

The seventh grade has just finished a chapter on the sacrament of Baptism and will be starting one dedicated to the sacrament of Confirmation.

The seventh grade class will be preparing for a chapter test during coming week while the eighth grade will learn how to use the Pythagorean Theorem.

Eighth Grade News

Vocab-In Vocabulary, the students took their unit 12 test last week. The students started unit 13 this past week. They should start preparing for their skills final which will be on units 1-15. Grade 8 Social Studies-

We have been learning about the Gilded Age and Progressivism. We discussed the influenza outbreak of 1918. Next week, we will learn about the First World War.

Grade 8 Literature-

We are wrapping up The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn. We will close out the year with a unit on poetry.
