pastor's letter

from pastor jane

This may be an alternative to our second service on Sunday at 11:15, or in addition to it. You were probably quite young when you figured out that, if you obeyed your parents, you were rewarded – blessed – whereas, if you didn't, there were unpleasant consequences. If you've continued in that habit of fulfilling your parents' wishes and honoring them with your obedience, you find that life at home can be quite harmonious.

Maybe you have friends who've gone down a different path, a path of rebellion and disrespect for and disobedience to their parents. Their home life is tense, even combative. Responsible parents who are accountable to God for how they bring up their children remain firm in their efforts to raise children who submit to their authority and, ultimately, to God's authority over them. Not many blessings are found in these homes where strife and tension reign.

Do you recall that the people of Israel were in the desert for forty years when the whole journey from Egypt to the Promised Land could have taken just days? Why was that? Because the people were rebellious, disobedient, unwilling to trust God Who knew what was best for them, just as He knows what is best for us today. They rebelled against Moses who had been placed by God in a position of leadership over them, just as too often children rebel against their parents who have been placed over them by God.

God is serious about rebellion and disobedience. He spent 14 verses talking about the blessings that come through obedience and 54 verses talking about curses that come through disobedience in Deuteronomy 28.

Stewardship is your response to God. Do you respond in humble obedience, or do you fight against His authority? Will you reap blessings or curses?

Think about it:

 It may take awhile to read Deuteronomy 28. Do it anyway. Can you relate any of God's blessings and curses to your life? Write them down.

Do you have a rebellious spirit? Ask God to make you desire to be humble and obedient.



Let's pray: Lord, I confess that I am not always willing to submit to the authority of my parents or teachers. Help me to see that this is the same as rebellion against You. Give me grace to back off from what I want and listen to those You have placed in my life to give me direction and guidance. In Jesus' name I pray. Amen.

In 1 Timothy 6:9-10, we read some very, very strong words that provide a deterrent to falling prey to a materialistic lifestyle style. We read, "But those who desire to be rich fall into temptation, into a snare, into many senseless and harmful desires that plunge people into ruin and destruction. For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evils. It is through this craving that some have wandered away from the faith and pierced themselves with many pangs." Paul tells us these money temptations are a "snare." An example of a snare is in fishing. Fishermen use shiny snares that are very attractive to the fish. Once they bite into the snare, they are hooked. Worldly glitter can be attractive to us too. We, like those fish, can be hooked at the first bite. Jesus tells us also in very strong terms that "the deceitfulness of riches and the desire for other things enter in and choke the Word, and it proves unfruitful" (Mark 4:19). This is very subtle. This deceit is undetected while we are busy working, accumulating, striving to satisfy our every whim. This leads to debt and stress. It all seems normal; this is the way life is. Everyone else is doing it. It is not like we wake up one day and decide to live this way. It just happens. With God's help we can detect the snares of the world.

Father, grant me strength to resist the temptations and snares of this materialistic world. Amen.
