#### Cat Ad"Mice" 101: by: Sydney

#### Tip 1

If you adopt a cat, start out small when you bring them home such as in your bathroom or bedroom, somewhere small, quiet, and safe for your new feline friend. Keeping them in a small area helps them adjust to sounds, smells, and your daily routine, then gradually make their space bigger and bigger till they are comfortable with you and their surroundings.

#### Tip 2

Yay, you got your first cat but don't have supplies. Don't worry. Here is your main go-to list

- <u>Food</u> Find a good food that is best for your cat (don't feed them too much or too little)
- Water Good filtered water
- **Shelter** Places for them to hide (In your home)
- Toys Things they can toss around, chase, and use their instincts
- <u>Grooming supplies</u> Some cats don't need much grooming but they may need something more like a bath or nails trimmed. Get a cat brush, clippers, or cat-friendly soap. Don't forget a clean litterbox!
- Exercise Cats need lots of play. Most cats prefer climbing and clawing so get your cat a cat tree or even a box to scratch instead of your new couch.
- <u>Medical</u> The most common problem is cats reproducing fast. Spay or neuter them. Cats also need yearly vet checkups for shots (Depending on the age it may vary).
- LOVE They need you; someone to love, care for, and spoil them.

#### Tip 3

Wrong Ways to Hold a Cat

- Ignoring a cat's body language. Remember cats are independent animals that don't always want to be touched or held.
- Picking them up by surprise. Before you pick up your cat you should reassure them and make sure they're ready.
- Not supporting your cat's hindquarters.
- Scuffing your cat
