Cold and Flu Season

Cold and flu season is unfortunately upon us, and we need your help to keep our preschool a healthy place for everyone. We are asking parents to please keep your child at home if he/she is not feeling well. Although this is obvious in cases of fever or vomiting, it is just as important when the child has a continuous runny nose, a bad cough, or is just feeling a bit off. It is natural for children, even when they are feeling unwell, to tell their parents they want to go to school because school is fun. However, this same child will have difficulties concentrating in class, and will require a considerable amount of attention from our teachers, taking their focus away from the class as a whole. As well, after a few sneezes directly into the playdough, they are guaranteed to pass their germs onto other students and the teachers. Thank you for making your best effort to keep our classrooms a healthy place for everyone. Your consideration of our teachers and other students is much appreciated!

No Cook Playdough Recipe

2 cups white flour
1 cup salt
2 tsp. cream of tartar
2 tsp. vegetable oil
2 cups of BOILING water with food colouring added to it

Mix all ingredients in a bowl, turn out onto counter and knead until smooth. Store in an airtight container.
