Victor Oscar Kain, 85, of Fillion died Friday, April 26, 2002, at his home where he lived since 1948. He was born Feb. 21, 1917 in Owendale, son of the late Jacob and Mary (Kuhl) Kain. He graduated from Owendale High School and farmed with his dad until he was inducted into the U.S. Army. He served from 1941 to 1946. Victor and Mildred Nelson were married June 12, 1943.
