What Do You Need To Know To Do Differently Now That You Have Softened Water?

Since the unit takes out all of the “hard” mineral ions, soap does not have to fight so hard to go to solution when you add it. This means that you will want to change a few actions:

#1 Use 1/3 the amount of soap that you have previously been using:

- Dish Detergent
- Laundry Detergent
- Shampoo
- Body Soap

What is that slippery feeling?

That “soapy” or “slippery” feeling is your body’s natural oil coming to the surface of your skin.

A good way to check is to lick the back of your hand if you are in the shower.

If it tastes “soapy”-you have used too much soap, continue to rinse.

What am I responsible for with the unit?

#1 Set the time on the clock.

You need to make sure that if the power goes out, you re-set the clock. The instructions are on the head of the unit and in the booklet that came with it.

This generally involves pushing a button that reads “Set Clock”, then follow with pushing on the “UP” or “DOWN” arrows to set the time within the closest hour AM/PM.

This is mostly important because the unit regenerates (cleans itself) at the factory pre-set time of 2:00 AM on the designated night while you’re sleeping. If the clock is off by a few to several hours, it may regenerate mid day or whenever it reads 2:00 AM.

#2 Make sure you add SALT!

If you forget to add salt, after awhile the unit will begin to give you “hard” or “iron-y” water again. You will notice the feel will change, you will have that white

mineral layer back on your skin and your glassware.

You need to plan roughly on at least (1) 40 lb. bag per month in an active household. Newer units with metered heads regenerate based on gallons used not set days = more efficient!

Here are some reminder suggestions:

1. If you pay your bills on the first of the month, make a note to go put a bag of salt in the brine tank that day.
2. If you like to go downstairs less often, make a note on your calendar every 4 months to put 4 bags in.

Please remember to use “Solar Salt” or any salt which says that it is for a water softener. Fancier salts than that just cost you extra money for little change.

Please remember to have the unit get checked every 2-3 years to prolong its life. Think of it like changing the oil on your car, makes it last longer right?
