Review of 2018 Goals & 2019 Goal Setting -

Trustees – Greg reported that last year the goals of cleaning up the trees in the front and planting grass was completed, the sewer was repaired, repairs were completed at the parsonage and the columbarium was completed. For 2019 they want to do a cemetery fundraiser, replace the audio visual equipment, promote electronic giving, complete more parsonage repairs, do an auction/dinner fundraiser, fix the curb and grass and continue to grow Team Hope.

Music & Worship – Sue reported that goals for last year included getting the sound tech position paid, obtaining a blue tooth, include the youth in worship readings and incorporate more special music into the worship services. For 2019 they will continue to include the youth and schedule special music, review the current and future state of the numerous pianos.

Deacons – Michelle reported their goals for 2019 will be to continue to work on communion with the shut-ins and visitation; continue to support Pastor Jane & Sandy with these efforts and possibly add additional help.

F/Y/E – Angie reports last years goals were to find concurrent curriculum for Sunday School, which they are still working on as well as get more involved with the youth activities, events and community involvement. For 2019 they will communicate with the Youth Leaders for planning events, etc. Have the Sunday School classes sing in church once a month and review the Sunday School list for inactive members and reach out to them.

Executive Committee – Tracy reports that the goals for last year included a smooth transition for Paul and Sheryl, increased communication, assist the transition committee as needed, provide Q &A sessions, have committees provide brief reports during church services, and maintain a positive outlook. For 2019 we will continue to maintain our positive outlook, increase communication by re-establishing the brief committee reports during services, form a call Committee and support them as needed, and continue to support the transition committee.

Women of Hope – No report. Request was made that the wedding coordinator position be reestablished.

Benevolence Report – Pastor Jane stated that \$1500 was given last month. They are researching educational/

training opportunities for Alzheimer's/Dementia, etc. We will do a second offering during the service for them.

Pastor's Report – Pastor Jane updated us on her youth, visitation/pastoral care and enrichment through bridging and transitioning projects.

President's Report – Joan reported a call committee has Been formed, we will review this during New Business.

Brief Committee Reports

Deacons – Michelle reports they have met with Pastor Jane regarding Befriender and the communion list is complete for 3/10.

Family/Youth/Education – Michelle states the Soup & Sandwich schedule for Lent is complete; Macy's have volunteered to be the Youth Director's again, we will review under New Business; Julia Albright and her group will be here the weekend of 3/10; Kate Moore has joined the FYE committee; a 55" TV has been purchased for the youth; and two students will receive \$100 each for their upcoming mission trips.

Music & Worship – Sue stated that readers are secure and choir will resume following the bad weather.

Trustees – Greg reports the accounts look good with a balance of \$26,000 so they will repay the loan from the designated funds of \$9998.98. Expenses were down again last month. They will be working on a job description and a compensation package for the new pastor. Motion to approve the Treasurer's Report pending audit - by Tim, second by Cindy, Motion carried unanimously.

Old Business:

Transition Team Report – Greg mentioned that the job description is being developed. We will meet with the Call Committee during next month's meeting, March 10th.

New Business:

Call Committee – Joan stated that the Call Committee has been formed. Members include Carrie Carlin, Connie Radtke, Jeremy Mienert, Bennett Osmonson, Wayne Larson, Chuck Lucken, Sue Simonson, and possibly Chris Hove. Motion was made by Tracy and seconded by Nancy, approved unanimously.

Funeral Policy – reviewed.

Next meeting will be held on March 13 at 8:00 - devotions and lunch to be provided by the board of Music & Worship. The 2019 meeting schedule was reviewed. Full council meetings will be held in February, May, September and December.

Youth Director – Alyssa & Mike Macy have volunteered. Motion was made by Michelle O., second by Greg, approved unanimously.

Bev and Dean Lindberg would like to borrow a piano for a month this summer. Motion made to approve by Tim, second by Greg, approved unanimously.

Finding Contentment in Jesus

In the Apostle Paul's letter to the people in Philippi, he wrote, "I have learned to be content whatever the circumstances. I know what it is to be in need, and I know what it is to have plenty" (Philippians 4:11-12 NIV). We are told by Paul that contentment is a state of mind that is not dependent upon external circumstances. True contentment comes from knowing that God is in control and that He will provide for us.

As God's people, we need to be aware that the society in which we live is trying hard to make us discontent. Advertisements suggest that we can't be content without expensive houses, new cars, exotic vacations, big investments, and the latest in clothes. Our culture tries to make us believe that happiness and contentment are within our reach if we acquire just a few more things.

Our contentment should not be based on the size of our incomes or on our net worth. It has nothing to do with the size of our houses or year of our cars. Contentment can't be bought at a department store or travel agency. Real contentment is not related to outward circumstances.

For many, acquiring money can become a preoccupation and an obsession. We can become slaves to wealth. Greed will not allow contentment, because it will always urge us to acquire more. No matter how we try, we cannot be satisfied by worldly things. The love of money can potentially possess a person's life like no other emotion can. Jesus spoke about the futility of greed in Matthew 16:26 when He asked, "For what will it profit a man if he gains the whole world, and forfeits his soul?" The things we possess will contribute only to fleeting happiness, not an enduring peace and contentment.

When we place our security in money, pride, self-centeredness, and self-sufficiency take over as we make ourselves god, trusting in ourselves rather than God to provide. We become like the Rich Fool, who gave himself credit for his success and desired even more (Luke 16:13-21). We can push God out of our lives.

Contentment comes from dependence on the Lord. When God is our security, we can be content. The Apostle Paul knew both the secret of contentment and how to receive it. Paul told the Philippians and us, "I can do all things through Him Who strengthens me" (Philippians 4:13). Without Christ, we will never achieve contentment. A relationship with Christ will redirect our focus from transient earthly pleasures to things of eternal significance. Keeping our eyes on "the prize" (Philippians 3:14) will bring about gratitude in our hearts for what we have rather than desiring what we don't have.
