We're Going Old School

"Stand at the crossroads and look; ask for the ancient paths, ask where the good way is, and walk in it, and you will find rest for your souls." — Jeremiah 6:16

Recently I found myself meditating on the identity of our church. We have been described as a church living between two identities. In many ways we have embraced many of the modern elements of Christian worship, but there are also trappings of the past that we just can't bring ourselves to let go. We are the most modern traditional church in the area! And that meditation inspired me to take a look at some of the traditions we have let go, what value they had, and why it's okay to revisit them from time to time, and why it's also okay to put them away as we go forward.

As we step into February, I invite you to join us on a journey through time with our new sermon series, **"Old School."** In this series, we will rediscover the beauty, meaning, and importance of the rich traditions that have shaped Christian worship for generations.

In our fast-moving world, it's easy to overlook the depth and wisdom found in the classic hymns, the structure of liturgy, the creeds that have anchored our faith, and even the instruments that have led generations in praise and brought us into today. But these traditions hold more than just nostalgia—they carry profound theological truths, uniting us with believers across centuries and around the world.

Throughout this series, we will explore:

Classic Hymns – Why do certain songs stand the test of time and inspire generation after generation? What do these songs teach us about God's character?

The Liturgy & Creeds – How do these time-honored words shape our faith and remind us of God's promises?



The Common Lectionary – How does following a shared calendar of Scripture readings and teachings help us stay grounded in God's Word

Instruments of Worship – From organs and pianos to guitars and drums, how have musical styles changed, and what can we learn from them about how people praise God?

Jeremiah 6:16 reminds us that sometimes, the best way forward is to look back—back to the faithful ways that have led countless believers before us. Whether these traditions are deeply familiar to you or completely new, we pray this series will deepen your appreciation for the "old school" elements of worship and how they continue to shape our walk with Christ today.


Join us each Sunday as we take a step back—not just to reminisce, but to reconnect with the timeless practices that still strengthen and inspire our faith.

Tickets will be \$19 per person for the pre-game event and the game. Sign up to reserve tickets with the church office.










Attention TobyMac fans. Pastor Ryan has additional seats available for our youth group outing to see Tobymac on February 27th at the Huntington Center.

Worship and church activities will be held as usual - please use common sense and precaution when traveling.


Ottawa County Level 2:

First Aid Equipment & Medical Supplies

There is first aid equipment and supplies in the basement kitchen, fellowship hall pantry and church office for your use. There is also an AED in the connecting hallway near the restrooms.

We have been blessed with the donation of a few wheelchairs, walkers, crutches, slings, bandages, ice packs, etc. that would help in a medical situation in the building or for someone in immediate need. These are located in the basement kitchen for your use as needed.

There are a number of different ways to give to your church, as listed below:


 Give to the church via Sunday offering, US Mail, or drop off (A wooden collection box is located on the wall outside the lower coat room for your convenience throughout the week.)

• **Give in App -** Download the Tithe.ly App from the <u>App Store</u> (iPhone) or <u>Google Play Store</u> (Android). Once you've downloaded the app, create an account or log in, locate our church and tap "Give Now" to complete your contribution.



What is the Contingent Fund?

Do you know what the Contingent Fund is used for? This is the fund that <u>ALL</u> building and maintenance items are paid out of. So when something breaks or requires maintenance, we pay for it out of this fund. Examples of other items that are paid out of the Contingent Fund include:

Firm Foundation Campaign


