





In Memoriam Norman Brinker 1903-2009

2009 saw the passing of Norman Brinker, a Dallas-Icon who changed the way America eats. He was just as legendary in the Polo world as the restaurant world. In 1972 he founded the Willow Bend Polo & Hunt Club in Plano and grew it into the largest and most successful polo club in the world. In its heyday, Willow Bend was the place to be on a Sunday Afternoon for celebrities and locals alike during what many have called the "golden years of polo in Texas." Back then Willow Bend was considered to be out in the country...just like Oak Point. At Prestonwood we honor the memory of visionary Norman Brinker.
