

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING SOLICITATION WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE TOWN OF CLOVERDALE, INDIANA, PROVIDING A PENALTY THEREFOR AND CREATING CERTAIN EXCEPTIONS THERETO.

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF CLOVERDALE, INDIANA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Peddlers prohibited upon private property.

The practice of going in or upon private residences in the Town of Cloverdale, Indiana, by solicitors, peddlers, hawkers, itinerant merchants or transient vendors of merchandise not having been requested or invited so to do by the owner or owners, occupant or occupants, of said private residences, for the purpose of soliciting orders for the sale of goods, wares and merchandise and/or disposing of and/or peddling or hawking the sales, is declared to be a nuisance and punishable as such nuisance as a misdemeanor.

Section 2. Penalty.

Any person violating the provisions of section 1 above, shall upon conviction thereof, be fined not more than one hundred (\$100.00) dollars or imprisoned not more than thirty (30) days or both fined and imprisoned in the discretion of the court.

Section 3. Exceptions.

The provisions of section 1 above shall not apply to the sale, or soliciting of orders for the sale of milk, dairy products, vegetables, poultry, eggs and other farm and garden produce so far as the sale of the commodities named herein is now authorized by law.

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication as required by law.
