Funded initially by a grant from the **Sunderland Foundation**, tirelessly built by volunteer labor provided by our Thursday Volunteers, and countless other groups including the **Kansas City Carpenters Union**, we have effectively doubled our overnight retreat space at Hollis.

This summer, our Hollis Crossings Counselors were able to enjoy these spaces ... providing

comfortable private space for them to recharge while serving our campers from the KC Metro.

The Lodge is almost always in use, so finding time to work on the space without disrupting guests is at times difficult. We refaced all of the kitchen cabinets, repainted the floor and walls and installed granite countertops in the restrooms, thanks to ROCKTOPS—Stone & Granite Fabrication of Olathe!

The Meadow Cottage previously only had twin & full beds. We have replaced the full with a brand new queen mattress, and the bunk bed room now is outfitted with a with a brand new full bed. The comfort level of the space improved 100%!

COMMUNITY GARDEN?

We are exploring the idea of building a high-tunnel community garden to be maintained in partnership with various home school groups & additional community organizations.

Hollis has been in our present location for 33 years now...and much like your homes, every once in a while we need to update and repair a few things. We started this process during the height of the pandemic lockdown, and it has become obvious that more things are in a need of repair and updating!

HIDEAWAY NEEDS

- Repair road to the Hideaway—The road is full of ruts, caused by use and water run off, and constantly in need of repair. Our goal is to permanently address the issue and pave it with asphalt.
- Renovate shower 22 years of use takes its toll. The only shower in the Hideaway needs a facelift and a redesign to ensure ADA accessibility.
- New living room furniture & fresh coat of paint—Sometimes your favorite chair just wears out and needs replacing. We have a couch that needs replacing, and the entire space could use a fresh coat of paint.

ADDITIONAL NEEDS

- Replace windows in Lodge— Every month or so another one breaks and can no longer be opened. Repairs are impossible as replacements parts are unavailable.
- Build ADA accessible ramp for Tiny Cabins The last part of the construction for Tiny Cabins is the addition of an ADA ramp. The increase in material costs prohibited us from completing this section of the plan
- Rebuild Hollis entry sign Our beautiful entry sign is slowly deteriorating due to weather and age. Our plan is to meticulously deconstruct, and rebuild with cedar with the help of our Thursday Volunteers.
