





Advance care planning conversations help to ensure that a person's beliefs, values, and preferences are understood, and then documented, so that they are in place to guide future decision-making at a time when a person is unable to make their wishes known to their healthcare team. Carla will help you design a plan that honors our end-of-life healthcare wishes.

The Importance of Advance Directives

Why is an Advance Directive important? An advance directive is important when you're badly hurt or have a serious illness that keeps you from making medical decisions for yourself. It tells your doctors and other health care workers what type of care you would like to have.

<u>What is an Advance Directive:</u> Part 1: Living Will—a form that states the type of medical treatment you want to receive as you near the end of your life and if you can no longer speak for yourself. Part 2: Health Care Power of Attorney (POA) - allows you to name a person to make treatment decisions for you when you can't speak for yourself. This person can be a spouse, partner, parent, friend, or someone you trust to make health decisions for you.

If you are planning to make a contribution to the Church, you might want to consider making a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD). Anyone 70.5 years of age or older can give up to \$100,000 as a tax-free gift, in the form of a QCD, from their traditional IRA account.

bution The funds will come from your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) calculated amount and must be transferred directly from the IRA to an

eligible charity/church by the IRA custodian in order to qualify for the tax break. The QCD should be the first distribution from the IRA account each year if you want it to be fully tax deductible (so you don't exceed your RMD amount). The donated QCD is EXCLUDED from your taxable income.

Your stockbroker or banker will have the required paperwork to file for information on the charity and will make the check out in the charity's name. You can also talk to your tax preparer.

The Development of Valentine's Day as a Romantic Holiday.

According to legend, a Catholic priest named Valentine was beheaded on February 14 for performing weddings in defiance of Emperor Claudius II. The priest may have befriended and healed the emperor's jailer's daughter, Julia, who was blind. On the night before his execution, Valentine wrote a note to Julia, he signed, "Love, from your Valentine."

The day became associated with romantic love in the 14th and 15th centuries. In the 18th—century England, people exchanged flowers, candy, and greeting cards to express their love. In the 19th century, handmade cards were replaced by mass-produced cards.

Today, Valentine's Day is celebrated in many countries, including the United States, England, Mexico, Canada, France, and Australia.
