
You Are 9wited Mass for the Loss of a Child

The Book of the Month for both September and October 2025 is *The Good, The Messy, and the Beautiful: The Joy and Struggles of Real Married Life* by Edward and Beth Sri. The Word of God Alive:

Discussing the Readings with your children

In today's Gospel, Jesus' friends ask him to give them more faith. Maybe

they thought they would be more important then or maybe they wanted to be stronger to do what Jesus wanted them to do.

Jesus said that even if they had faith the size of a mustard seed, it would be enough to be able to tell a big strong tree to tear itself out of the ground and throw itself into the sea! Can you imagine telling a tree to pull itself out of the ground and throw itself into the sea? Of course not. Jesus was trying to teach his friends that even a little bit of faith in God was good enough.

The way we keep our faith is by having a relationship with God. To grow that friendship we need to talk and spend time with God in prayer and at Mass.

You can share with God what happened during the day, your feelings when you are happy and sad. You can tell God, "I love you", and "I'm sorry" when you have hurt him. You can ask for God's help.

We believe, even when we have a little faith, a faith as small as a mustard seed, that God hears our prayers. He will answer our prayers, but sometimes it takes a long time and sometimes the answer is not what we were expecting. God knows what is best for us and sometimes the answers to our prayers are different than we want.






