

AMERICAN AIRLINES FREE BAGGAGE ALLOWANCE

Effective immediately, American Airlines (AA) aligned their baggage allowance policies. Please see their official statement in the link below

As highlighted, their Long-haul International Main cabin tickets in all markets will include one free checked bag. This new policy shall impact itineraries combining AA and PR, where AA is the carrier on the first coupon of the overall ticket.

For your reference, below is the Baggage rule for Multi-City Travel for travel originating US:

If your itinerary is in one ticket and originates from the USA, the first Marketing Carrier determines the baggage allowance. First marketing carriers can apply their own airline rule.

Sectors via PAL and Partner Airlines.

Sector	Marketing Carrier
Miami - Los Angeles	PARTNER AIRLINE as First Marketing Carrier determines your FBA and excess baggage charges
Los Angeles - Manila	PAL

Using the above example, if the Partner Airline is AA, then AA's new baggage allowance policy shall apply to the entire itinerary since AA is the First Marketing Carrier on the MIA-LAX sector immediately.

Consequently, if the itinerary originates from the Philippines, where PAL is the first Marketing Carrier, PR baggage policy will follow up to the final destination.

Sector	Marketing Carrier
Miami - Los Angeles	PAL as First Marketing Carrier determines your FBA and excess baggage charges
Los Angeles - Manila	PARTNER AIRLINE
