Greetings to everyone from your new Winter Trip Director! First of all, and most importantly I'd like to give **Marina Sallaway** a huge THANK YOU for her hard work, patience, and diligence for being Trip Director for so many years. I'm just touching the tip of the iceberg and it was a monstrous task for her. This season I wish she can come on more trips and enjoy them more without as much stress leading up to it. Luckily she is assisting me with the transition and I appreciate your patience and understanding if (when) I slip up. Hopefully it won't be anything major.

Here are the dates for this coming season which have been reviewed by the instructors and approved by Mammoth.

Cancellation policies have been getting earlier and are now typically 60 days. Condo spots will be first committed first served, with students given priority. Late cancellations may be subject to pay unless we can find someone to take the spot. We will likely stick with a set cost per person per night for those staying in a club reserved condo, but be aware that condo prices have risen (like everything else) so we may have to charge a little more. We should know what the amount will be within the next few weeks and will post on the website.

This summer six new pilots were honored with a Wing Pinning Ceremony at the Oshkosh AirVenture event on Tuesday, July 26th in Oshkosh, Wisconsin. Thanks to scholarships and an intensive six-week flight-training program offered by Able Flight at Purdue University, these wheelchair-bound young people are now officially pilots. Who said it shouldn't and couldn't be done? If I can do this (snow skiing), I can do anything! Even fly!

It was exciting to watch this ceremony. Congratulations to Andy Burnette, Ryan Chen, Stephanie Cibello, Austin "Chance" Field, Nathaniel Miller, and Chris Murad. I was able to meet and chat with these brand new pilots, who live in all parts of the US. One of the pilot was not able to make it to the ceremony. Ryan Chen

is almost my neighbor here in Marina del Rey! He will hopefully start skiing with us next season. Ryan became disabled due to a snowboarding accident in 2009. He is the co-founder of Neurogum. (I just looked it up, it's an interesting product.) His proud mother flew in from Japan to watch Ryan receive his pilot wings.

This is Able Flight's 16th year of providing full-ride flight-training scholarships and aviation career training scholarships. This wonderful non-profit organization is based in North Carolina and together with Purdue University in Indiana enables people with disabilities to become pilots as a hobby or train them for aviation industry careers. Able Flight makes dreams, that seem out of reach, take flight, by helping these individuals become pilots.

One of the inspirational speakers at this ceremony was Jessica Cox, the world's first armless pilot. Jessica is a motivational speaker and owns her

own airplane. What an amazing woman and an inspiration to us all.

Able Flight selects six individuals each year to receive this pilot training. The sponsors supporting the scholarships are: ForeFlight, Lockheed Martin, Hartzell Propeller, Aircraft Spruce & Specialty, and Sporty's Pilot Shop. What an exciting program. PS: Another note to our members: You might remember one of our members, Chris Hargreaves? He passed away several years ago, but he used a wheelchair and decided after many years of skiing, that he also wanted to learn to fly. Chris took lessons up at Big Bear from a wheelchair pilot instructor and became a pilot. We flew together almost every week, heading somewhere for lunch. Twice we flew all the way to the East Coast. Chris was an amazing person. Many of us have wonderful memories of Chris. ♦

Move United Waiver & Release of Liability Agreement

Move United, and its affiliated Chapters (“Released Parties”) are non-commercial, not for profit activity providers. The purpose of this Move United Waiver & Release of Liability Agreement is to exempt, waive, and relieve Released Parties from any and all liability for any harm, wrongful death, personal injury, property damage, claim or cause of action, including, but not limited to liability arising from the negligence of Released Parties. “Released Parties” include Move United, Disabled Sports USA Los Angeles – The Unrecables, and their affiliates, successors, predecessors, parents, subsidiaries, owners, representatives, administrators, directors, officers, agents, coaches, employees, contractors, assigns, and volunteers; other participants, sponsoring agencies, sponsors, and advertisers; and, if applicable, the owners, operators, and lessors of premises on which the activities or events take place.

In consideration of the undersigned Participant being allowed to participate in any way in Move United and/or Disabled Sports USA Los Angeles – The Unrecables related events and activities, the Undersigned (“Undersigned” means the Participant or the Participant’s parent, legal guardian, or legal representative when the Participant is under the age of 18 or legally incapacitated) agrees and acknowledges as follows:

1. Risks of Activity. Participant will be taking part in activities that can be hazardous and involve the risk of physical injury and/or death. The activities are inherently dangerous and Undersigned fully realizes the dangers of participating in the activities. The dangers and risks of the activities include, but are not limited to the condition of the premises and equipment, and the acts, omissions, representations, carelessness, and negligence of the Released Parties. Recognizing the risks and dangers, the Undersigned voluntarily chooses for Participant to participate in the activities and expressly assumes all risks and dangers of the participation in the activity, whether or not described above, known or unknown, inherent, or otherwise.

2. Risks of Participation. The Undersigned recognizes and understands that while Released Parties have undertaken reasonable steps to lessen the risk of transmission of communicable diseases, including but not limited to, COVID-19, in connection with participation in the activities, the Released Parties are not responsible in any manner for any risks related to communicable diseases in connection with Participant’s participation in the activities. Specifically, the Undersigned understands that COVID-19 is a highly contagious and dangerous disease, and that contact with the virus that causes COVID-19 may result in significant personal injury or death. The Undersigned is fully aware that participation in the activities carries with it certain inherent risks related to transmission of communicable diseases (“Inherent Risks”) that cannot be eliminated regardless of the care taken to avoid such risks. Inherent Risks may include, but are not limited to, (1) the risk of coming into close contact with individuals or objects that may be carrying a communicable disease; (2) the risk of transmitting or contracting a communicable disease, directly or indirectly, to or from other individuals; and (3) injuries and complications ranging in severity from minor to catastrophic, including death, resulting directly or indirectly from communicable diseases or the treatment thereof. Further, the Undersigned understands that the risks of all communicable diseases are not fully understood, and that contact with, or transmission of, a communicable disease may result in risks to the Participant including but not limited to loss, personal injury, sickness, death, damage, and expense, the exact nature of which are not currently ascertainable, and all of which are to be considered Inherent Risks.

The Undersigned hereby voluntarily accepts and assumes all risk of loss, personal injury, sickness, death, damage, and expense for the Participant arising from such Inherent Risks. Furthermore, the Undersigned represents and warrants that Participant does not knowingly carry any communicable diseases that may be transmitted during participation in the activities.

3. Release and Indemnification.
