As always, if you need any assistance with anything, do not hesitate to Bark at me.

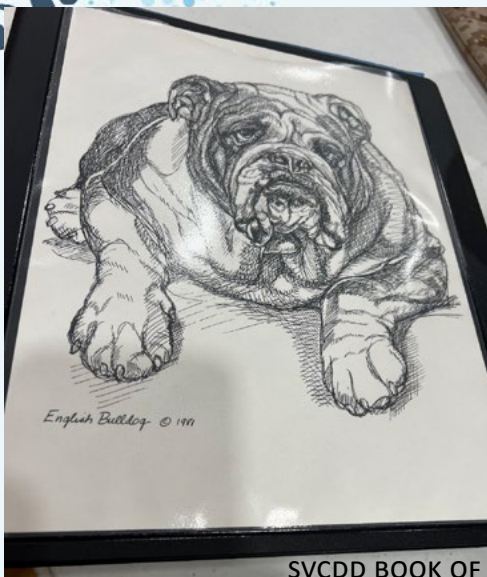

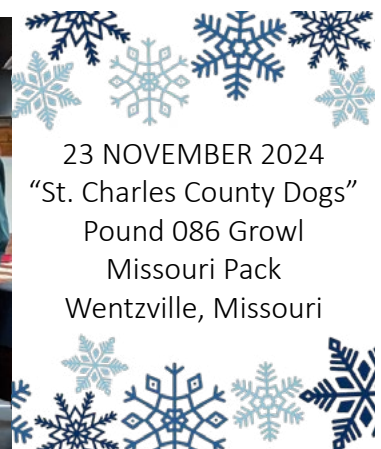

This is also a great opportunity to sell tickets if your Pound or Pack is holding a local raffle.

2. We need your help with the Children’s Hospital Donation. Those Big Bones come from:
 - Passport Stamps (One Big Bone you pay to have your MODD Passport Stamped at every Growl)
 - Passport Fines (Big Bones your Dog Robber fines you when your Passport is not filled out correctly)
 - Direct Contributions (Donations from individual Dogs, Pounds, and Packs)
 - Chief Devil Dog Passport Stamps (Donations you make to have the CDD or PCDD stamp your Passport)
3. Operation Chow Hound is a voluntary program. You may collect food, supplies, and/or Big Bones to donate to your local no kill shelter. This may be done on every level, Pound, Pack, and Kennel. Go to the Kennel Website for the OCH Reporting Form, Receipt of Donation Form, and Logo. The Honorable Quartermaster will have “Pound K-9” kits for your pets and OCH Patches for your vest available in the online Kennel Store. The Big Bones made from Pound K-9 Kits will be included in the annual donation for OCH.



4. Kennel Raffles. We need the support of you, your friends, your families, and the public. The Big Bones from online raffles on the Kennel Website are a significant portion of the Kennel Budget. We have a “Donate Button” on the Kennel Website: MilitaryOrderoftheDevilDogs.org. You can make a contribution to the Kennel, Children’s Hospital Fund, and Operation Chow Hound.

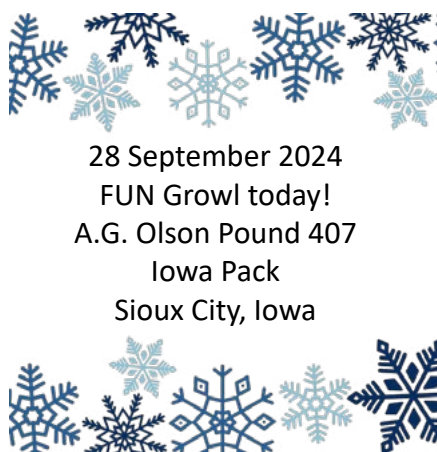

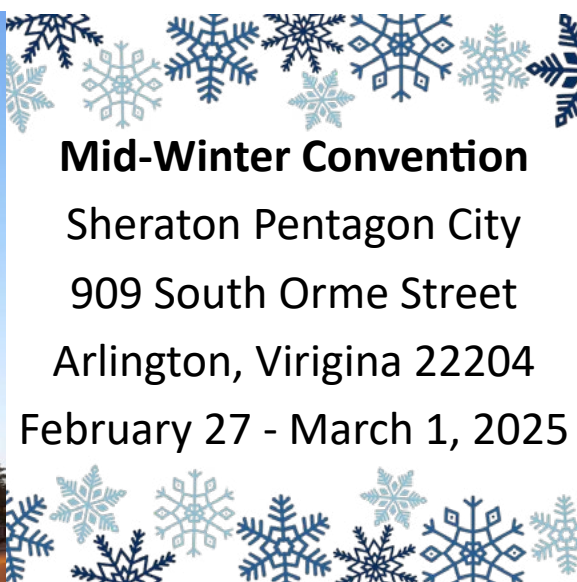

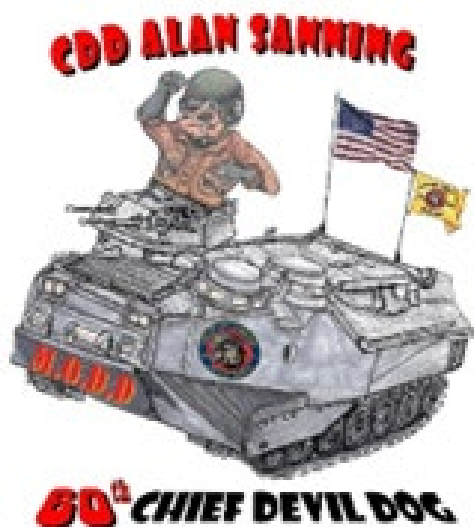

WOOF-WOOF and Happy New Year! How is it already 2025?!? I hope that all Dogs across the Kennel had a wonderful holiday season and are coming back together to celebrate the new year in Growl assembled!

Since my last article, the Dog Robber team has been hard at work on several projects! We have added a Transmittal Status spreadsheet to the Kennel Management Application, so Pound Dog Robbers know that transmittals have been received by the Kennel Dog Robber and where they are in the queue, since Transmittals are processed in the order they are received. That has allowed our Team to focus on processing paperwork versus answering questions about status.

Another HUGE step we have implemented in the Kennel Management Application is the ability for Pounds to print their own membership cards!

No need to wait for the Dog Robber team to print and mail cards any longer! Never fear, the Dog Robber team will still print membership cards; however, they need to be requested by the Dog Robbers from this point forward.

The Kennel Dog Robber Team and the Bits & Bytes Team are working together to continue improving the Kennel Management Application and making things easier for the Dog Robbers. I want to share a lot of those ideas, but I do not want to share them too early. I want to wait until we are ready to launch them.

In November, we held a call with the Dog Robbers, sharing the updates we have been making and some of the ideas we are working on. We know that change can be hard, but we hope that most of the changes we are making will be embraced and continue to help make our Kennel better and stronger for the future!

Woof Woof! Well, we Dogs survived the long holiday season, and we are looking forward to an exciting year full of fun and games. I know the Convention seems far away, but August comes before you know it. Here is just a reminder of what you need to have done before you leave for Grapevine, Texas.

There will be Dogs and their families from all over the nation. Since we will be strangers, I would like you to get the following documents together and bring them with you. If you have a living will, end-of-life directive, or you are an organ donor, make a copy of the documentation and please bring it with you. That information should be on your person or in your room.

In the past five years, we have had some Dogs and their family members taken to the local hospital. Take time to put the following information on a paper where it can be easily found (wallet, passport). This information will help if you are unable to talk for yourself.

- 1.) Emergency contact: name and phone number, including area code;
- 2.) Doctor or Primary Care Provider: name and phone number. If a VAMC, name of the facility and phone number;

- 3.) Pacemaker or history of heart problems, diabetic;
- 4.) Hip or knee replacement, etc. (in short, a brief medical history);
- 5.) List of all medications: name of drug, dosage. Bring enough meds and a prescription in case you lose your medicine;
- 6.) Living will, end-of-life directive, or are an organ donor;
- 7.) The name of the person that is with you and room number;

If you think you need an exception and cannot travel to Texas, you need to go through your Chain of Command to request one. Sorry, I cannot help you.

To help develop and implement new ideas and technologies that can help us expand growth, function, manage data, and its usage. It is also part of my job to ensure that we are using adequate technologies to help secure our data privacy, and still make sure we are compliant with the regulations we need to be, with the technologies we are using.

Well that was all a mouth-full, and I hope that it helps bring some clarity to some of what the Bits & Bytes Dogs do. I also understand that these are a lot of changes. Many people do not like change and it is understandable. For some, change can be difficult and technology can make others nervous about its usage. If you are a Dog Robber, a Pound Keeper, or Pack Leader, the Kennel Management Application, KMA, has been an amazing part of our technology usage. A super shout out to our Deputy Bits & Bytes Dog, PDD Jim Breen, and his wife, the Kennel Dog Robber, PDD Helen Breen, for all the amazing work that went into the new application. The innovation, desire, and ability of these PDDs is nothing short of amazing. If you are a Dog Robber, Pound Keeper, or Pack Leader and not up on using this system yet, you need to get involved with it. It is helping us in leaps and bounds to do things more timely and efficiently.
