

WESTON COUNTY CLERK RESIGNS AMID LEGAL TROUBLES

Last week was one of turmoil for the Weston County government, especially embattled Weston County Clerk Becky Hadlock. Fending off court cases here in Weston County concerning election mistakes and false reporting in the 2024 General Election and in Natrona County concerning her allegedly defying a legislative subpoena, Clerk Hadlock commenced a new legal fight on Wednesday afternoon, April 8th.

When she returned to the Weston County Courthouse from lunch, the Wyoming Department of Criminal Investigation took Clerk Hadlock into custody and booked her into County Jail following the filing of two felony charges against Clerk Hadlock and the issuance of a felony arrest warrant.

Clerk Hadlock was charged with violating Wyoming State

Statute 22-26-119, which is willful violation of Election Code, including willful failure to perform required duties or actions mandated by Election Code. If found guilty of this felony, Clerk Hadlock could face a maximum sentence of five years in prison and/or a \$10,000 fine.

Clerk Hadlock was also charged with violating Wyoming State Statute 22-26-107 a (iv), which is falsifying election documents with the intention to deceive or mislead voters or election officials. This felony carries the same punishment as the other, up to five years incarceration and/or a \$10,000 fine.

Shortly after being taken into custody, Clerk Hadlock was brought by law enforcement, dressed in red jail attire, to the Weston County Courthouse for her arraignment in Circuit Court. The Honorable Judge Lynda
