Section 2: How to Register

PARENTS/GUARDIANS ARE RESPONSIBLE TO REGISTER THEIR CAMPERS. IF YOU DO NOT HAVE INTERNET ACCESS TO DO SO,
FEEL FREE TO CALL OUR OFFICE AND WE WILL REGISTER YOUR CAMPER(S) OVER THE PHONE.
FOR EVERYONE'S SAFETY, AND TO ENSURE WE HAVE THE PROPER NUMBER OF ADULT VOLUNTEERS, EACH CAMPER
MUST BE REGISTERED BY JUNE 30, 2021 OR THEY MAY NOT BE ALLOWED TO ATTEND CAMP

- Step 1: Read ALL the information on these pages
- Step 2: Navigate to the "Programs & Events" page on our website at www.camparrahwanna.org/programs-events

Select the "Register Here" button to open the "2021 CAW Summer Registration Form" (it is a fillable PDF document)

- Step 3: Download and/or Save the document to your computer (be sure to remember where you saved it)
 - Tip: Use your camper's name when saving the file (Example: "2021.CAW.Reg_LauraYoung.pdf")

This will make it easier to keep track if you have multiple campers

- Step 4: Fill in ALL fields (especially the mandatory ones) on pages 1-4
- Step 5: Be sure to hit "SAVE" any time you make changes
- Step 6: Follow steps 3-5 again to create & save separate forms for EACH camper you are registering
- Step 7: Send the completed Registration Form(s) back to Camp Arrah Wanna by any of the following methods:
 - a. Attach completed PDF document to an email and send to program@camparrahwanna.org
 - b. Go back to the CAW "Programs & Events" page and use the "Upload Document" tool

Section 3: How to Pay for Camp

Step 1: LOOK FOR A CONFIRMATION EMAIL - Once CAW receives & processes your registration form, you will be sent an EMAIL CONFIRMATION PLEASE WAIT UNTIL YOU RECEIVE THAT EMAIL: it will include your total registration cost & further instructions for camp

Step 2: YOUR CONFIRMATION EMAIL WILL ALSO INDICATE WHICH PAYMENT OPTION APPLIES TO YOU:

OPTION 1: PAY YOUR CHURCH (CAW will work out payment with them)

Instead, please CONNECT WITH YOUR CHURCH representative to find out how much of the fee is your responsibility then PAY YOUR CHURCH directly for your camper's registration fee

When your child's registration form is received, CAW will notify your church. Once the church confirms your camper's connection, then a "Church Voucher" will be added to your camper's account. IT WILL STILL BE YOUR RESPONSIBILITY TO CONNECT WITH YOUR CHURCH AND PAY THEM FOR ANY AGREED REGISTRATION FEES.

OPTION 2: PAY CAMP ARRAH WANNA DIRECTLY

If your camper is NOT attending camp through one of the churches listed above, please submit payment for your balance before camp begins July 12th

You will have the option to pay by CREDIT/DEBIT CARD via a link in your CONFIRMATION EMAIL

When sending one check for multiple campers, NOTE THE AMOUNT THAT SHOULD BE APPLIED TO EACH CAMPER

PAYMENT OF BALANCE IS DUE AT OR BEFORE CHECK-IN

<u>CANCELLATIONS</u> made at least (2) two weeks before camp are eligible for a refund of all but a \$50 processing fee. Refunds will not be issued for cancellations made less than (2) two weeks prior to session, except in the case of illness or injury

<u>DISCOUNTS</u> will be applied and noted in CONFIRMATION EMAIL that is sent after CAW receives your camper's registration

- a. FIRST-TIME CAMPER: discount of \$20 if camper has never attended an overnight program at CAW
- b. SIBLING: discount of \$10 if (2) or more siblings per immediate family sign up for camp
- c. VOLUNTEER: discount of \$10 if camper and/or family member participated in a 2021 Volunteer Work Day

Section 4: Camper Scholarships

Need some help paying for camp? It's ok! We LOVE helping kids get to Camp Arrah Wanna!

CAW believes it is important for each camper/family to contribute SOMETHING towards their camp cost, but we never want people to miss out on this special opportunity because of an inability to pay the full registration fee. Because of that commitment, a partial scholarship will ALWAYS be awarded to any camper who takes the time to complete the steps below...

HOW TO APPLY FOR SCHOLARSHIP FUNDS:

- a. Please contact your local church for scholarship availability first
- b. If you aren't connect with a church, or they are not able to provide a scholarship, don't worry! Just follow these steps:
 - 1. Request the CAW Scholarship Application Paperwork
 - 2. Fill out the application (make sure it's complete)
 - 3. Submit Scholarship Application to the CAW office via email, snail-mail, our website, or fax

CAW Scholarships will not be awarded to individuals without completed paperwork on file.

Once the CAW Scholarship amount is confirmed, we will notify you via email about remaining balance & payment options.

Section 5: Health & Wellness (and COVID-19 info)

Health & safety is so important that CAW WILL NOT BE HOLDING CAMP IF the following volunteers/personnel are not in place:

- (2) Medical Professionals: to perform daily wellness checks in addition to managing regular camper health and medication needs
- (1) Wellness Counselor: available to help campers navigate emotional and mental-health needs
- (2) Adult Cabin Counselors for EACH cabin/group of 8 campers
- *** Please consider applying for a volunteer position today so you can help CAW provide AMAZING care for our campers ***

YOUR CAMPER'S HEALTH & INFORMATION:

Trained/certified medical personnel and nearby clinics assure that your camper is well taken care of while at Arrah Wanna. If there are any changes or additions to their medical inforamation, please contact the camp office prior to your arrival at camp.

Camper's insurance is primary.

MEDICATION REQUIREMENTS:

ALL MEDICATIONS (prescription & OTC) must be registered & left with the medical personnel upon check-in

CAW must have access to the ORIGINAL PRESCRIPTION CONTAINER with the original labeling

If you choose to soart your camper's meds into a daily/weekly pill container, you will still need to send the ORIGINAL PRESCRIPTION CONTAINER with at least (1) dose of the medication inside the container. This helps our medical personnel verify differences in the medication they distribute and helps us avoid questions and/or errors in administration.

Unless prescribed by a doctor, please do not check-in fluoride, as it creates excessive work for the medical staff

CAW'S COMMITMENT TO SAFETY:

CAW wants to keep ALL campers, volunteers, staff, and families safe while at Camp, in all ways, including preventing the spread of COVID-19

Because of that commitment, we always follow CDC, State, and County laws/rules in our programming, food service, and activities.

We ALSO want to make sure Camp is accessible to ANYONE who wants to come, so here are a few things you should know:

- 1. We are NOT requiring staff, volunteers, or campers to be vaccinated
 - Vaccination is a personal choice only you can make for you and your family. We respect your choice either way
- 2. The only reason we ask about vaccinations on the Registration Form is because that is important health history information that medical personnel may need to know if there happens to be an emergency
- 3. CAW will NOT be sharing personal information (including vaccination status) with ANY unauthorized personnel
- 4. Inclusion & non-discrimination is important to CAW. Therefore, we will NOT be separating, soarting, instructing, or treating campers, volunteers, or staff differently based on their vaccination status.
 - Example: In situations where masks are required for some, then we will ALL be wearing masks
 - Please only come to CAW if you are truly comfortable participating with others who may have different views than you
- 5. We are working very hard to provide a safe environment so that you and your campers are physically, emotionally, spirtually, and experiencially cared for. BUT we also know that everyone has different opinions about what exactly that looks like.

 If you are feeling uneasy about joining us in person this summer, please trust that instinct and pray about whether coming to CAW this summer is the best choice for you. We respect your decision and look forward to seeing you in the future.

Section 6: What we do at Camp Arrah Wanna

Spending a week at camp is one of the BEST things you will ever do! In the summer, we offer activities like swimming in the heated pool, Gaga Ball, playing creative and wacky games in the field, 9-Square, Crafts, a racecar derby, and so much more! Campers spend some time each day worshiping God through song and joyful activities, discussing questions in large and small groups, as well as more private cabin Bible study sessions. Camp Arrah Wanna is a place you are SURE to make life-long friends, learn more about how valuable you are in God's eyes (and to us), and have a blast while doing it. There are lots of testimonial vidos on our YouTube Channel that you can watch, but we encourage you to come check us out for yourself this summer.

Our theme for Summer 2021 is "We Are the World" - based on the collaborative song from the 1980s. We will be examining God's call to unity as expressed in Jesus' prayer in John 17. Part of that includes recognizing our call to serve as we come together as one. We will be sharing about folks who have answered that call to express God's love by seeking unity and service and challenging ourselves to consider how we live out Jesus's prayer and find ways to serve. One organization we will look at is "Charity: Water", an organization with a powerful start-up story, and we will be taking up a special offering to send to Charity: Water as a gift from all of us, together as one. Please come prepared to give in whatever capacity you are able to give. Maybe collect your loose change? Do some research and ask others to contribute?

Because our Virtual Camp experience was a BIG HIT last summer, and we have continued hosting wonderful virtual events throughout the year, we will be offering two "Virtual Campfire" events during the week before in-person Camp. This is an opportunity to get hyped for Camp and maybe get more comfortable as you see other Camper and Volunteer faces via Zoom.

* All items should be labeled with the campers name and phone number. Arrah Wanna cannot be held responsible for personal items that are lost, left behind, or stolen.

* Grades 9-12 are encouraged to bring classy "dress up" clothes for the RADSAW dinner & awards. It is AOK if you don't though!

PLEASE DO NOT BRING THE FOLLOWING ITEMS TO CAMP WITH YOU:

- 1. Non-prescription drugs or drug paraphernalia; alcohol of any kind; tobacco of any kind; marijuana of any kind; vaping of any kind
 Prescriptions medications must be checked in with Medical Personnel at check-in and will be administered as
 per Dr. and/or Guardian instructions.
- 2. Weapons: firearms, swords, knives, etc.
- 3. Inappropriate clothing: here are some examples:

Swimwear: if you have a two-piece bathing suits, you will be asked to wear a t-shirt/tank-top over it; no Speedo's! You will be asked to change into something more appropriate if your t-shirt has explicit pictures or words on it Shorts, dresses and skirts need to be a modest length (fingers don't touch skin if hanging your arms down to your side) Arrah Wanna leaders reserve the right to ask any camper to change their clothes at any time Let's dress in a way that is respectful to God, ourselves and each other!

IF PROHIBITED OBJECTS LISTED IN ITEM 1 & 2 ABOVE ARE FOUND IN THE POSESSION OF A CAMPER, ARRAH WANNA RESERVES THE RIGHT TO SEND THAT CAMPER HOME BY ASKING PARENT/GUARDIAN TO PICK THEM UP IMMEDIATELY

ITEMS OF VALUE ARE YOUR RESPONSIBILITY:

Cell phones, tablets, music players, video games, electronics, etc. can have a negative effect on your experience at camp just as easily as a positive one. If these items are used in a way that make others feel excluded, distract you from any activities, and/or disrupt group time, the CAW staff & leadership reserves the right to ask you to put them away for the remainder of camp. It is important to be engaged in the program while at camp at all times. Our leaders work hard to make the program relevant and safe to all campers, and we know electronics are an important way to stay connected to family and friends - but this is a unique opportunity to step away from our "normal routine" and see things from a new (and less-distracted) perspective.
