



The Rector writes

Dear Friends,

Advent Calendars. I hope you have yours if you are an Advent Calendar person. There is something rather special about opening those doors, seeing what images appear. As a child we had a calendar which invited us to read about examples of Christian witness and gave us a short prayer to say. We did this as a family and when we did this it was rather special and more to do with God and less to do with chocolate.

Advent is the gift of waiting on God. We generally are poor at waiting. And waiting for Christmas is particularly difficult. Just as children find it difficult to wait for Christmas, so adults in church want those carols now and get grumpy when we roll up to Church and are offered Advent hymns/carols instead. If you can't wait to sing carols join us on Monday 1 December at 6.00pm at the Alveley village light switch-on and join us in singing some favourite carols. Before rushing on to what we might think of as the 'main event', come along and enter this season with its own richness of music.

Please see our service page for what we have to offer at St Mary's and St Andrew's this Advent and Christmas.

For the last 2 years we have held a Christmas tree festival in St Mary's. This year the church family is going on a weekend retreat to help us focus on what Advent means to us in the 21st Century. "Fear not" - in the words of the angel Gabriel, we are pleased to announce that the Christmas tree festival will be back in 2026, so get your thinking caps on!

For many people outside the worshipping community, the Christmas Carol Service is one of those occasions when stepping inside Church is seen as safe. Our Christmas Carol Services are on Sunday 14 December at 6.00pm in St Andrew's Quatt and Friday 19 December at 7.00pm in St Mary's Alveley, both followed my mulled wine and mince pies.

We have little invitations that we can give you to pass onto friends with the highlight services across the season. Do take and do give to those in your circle of friends. Your invitation might be just the gift that they need this Christmas.

This time of the year there is so much going on. And sometimes, in all that, we can forget God, forget the reason why we gather, why we do all we do at Church. I'd like to give you this simple idea. As Christmas Cards arrive, take one or two to that place where you say your prayers. Hold them. Remember who sent them. Give thanks for that friendship over the years. And ask for the grace that you, like Mary, may carry Jesus into the world. No need to be sophisticated or complicated. Be a channel of love and hope, as Mary is for us. If you want more, then read Matthew's Gospel. That will be the main source of our Gospel Readings this year from Advent to Christ the King. It's long. So perhaps start at Matthew Chapel 5, which is the beginning of the Sermon on the Mount. Read that. Slowly. There will be plenty for the most spiritually hungry person to chew on for many weeks.

TEN FUN FACTS ABOUT CHRISTMAS TREES

Even before the time of Christ, evergreen trees were seen in winter as a symbol of fertility.

It was the 16th century monk, Martin Luther, who is credited with the idea of having lights on Christmas trees. He added candles to his tree, to look like stars in a forest.

Windsor Castle got its first Christmas tree in 1800, brought by Charlotte, wife of George III.

It was in 1835 that the term 'Christmas tree' was first used in English.

It was in the 1840s, when Prince Albert, consort of Queen Victoria, began bringing trees inside, that led to their popularity throughout the UK.


It was Woolworths who first sold manufactured Christmas tree ornaments – back in 1880.

The tree in London's Trafalgar Square has been a gift from the city of Oslo, Norway since 1947.

The world's tallest Xmas tree, at 221ft high, was erected in a Washington shopping mall in 1950.

In a survey of the nation's favourite smells, real Christmas trees came eighth, just behind the sea, but ahead of perfume.

About five million real Christmas trees are sold in the UK each year.



LIFE ILLUSTRATED

Just over a month ago the BBC online news featured the church at Cound and the efforts being made there to save a fairly rare medieval wall painting. Many months before that another Alveley bell ringer and I had been to a cheese and wine evening at Cound Village Hall to help raise money for the restoration of this painting. It seems a leaking roof, damp and age are deteriorating this 15th century doom painting and £50,000 is needed to restore it. St Mary's Alveley also has a doom or judgement painting on the wall in the side chapel. There is a very good framed explanation hung beneath it to which I can add very little. Doom paintings were popular in many churches when they were Roman Catholic before 1534. At this time churches were richly decorated with paintings, statues and gold ornaments. Our tower was plastered and painted white on the outside (you can still see the evidence). It was shorter and had a spire. In medieval times most people could not read or write and doom paintings showed in graphic form the fight between good and evil. Ours, which is probably about 14th century which was when the chapel was built, shows the Virgin Mary seated in the middle with the devil on the left representing death and evil and on the right a trumpeter who is heralding the arrival of good, a better life and a better afterlife. It also shows a man holding what appear to be bagpipes (!) or possibly about to draw his sword to fight on the Virgin Mary's behalf. Beneath Mary's feet are dragons or perhaps demons representing, of course, the triumph of good over evil. The message of this powerful image would have been unmistakable to illiterate parishioners. Unfortunately when Henry the 8th rejected the Roman Catholic faith in 1534 these images along with other adornments popular at the time were considered too pope-ish and were removed, destroyed or painted over. His successor, Edward the 6th, continued his destruction and the Victorians finished it, not just whitewashing over the paintings but even chipping the plaster off the walls in many cases. About 600 or so survive up and down the country, some in very good order as at Pickering in Yorkshire or like ours and the one at Cound. There is a rather unusual one at Claverley church. The historians cannot make up their minds about this one. First they thought it was a rather elaborate doom painting depicting vice and virtue, then they thought it was similar to the Bayeux tapestry showing the battle of Hastings in 1066 and now they think it may show the Knights Templar and the Crusades (1095 to 1291). This painting is in remarkably good condition and quite lively. Three of the knights are shown falling from their horses!

Children's books almost exclusively have illustrations to help with learning the text and comics such as the Beano and Dandy have always been popular but recently Anime, which is a Japanese style of animation, and in their comic books called Manga, has become hugely popular, selling millions of books. Many of the bigger bookshops have shelves or even whole sections devoted to manga books. Their stories tend to explore themes such as romance, adventure, social issues, sport, fantasy and, of course, good and evil. *Roy Page*

As I carve my pumpkin, help me pray this prayer: Open my mind so that I can learn about You (cut off the top of the pumpkin) Take all my sin and forgive all the wrong that I do (clean out the inside) Open my eyes so Your love I will see (cut eyes shaped like hearts) I'm sorry for the times I've turned up my nose at what You've given to me (cut a nose shaped like a cross) Open my ears so Your words I will hear (cut ears shaped like a Bible) Open my mouth to tell others You're near (cut the mouth in the shape of a fish) Let Your light shine in all I say and do! (place candle inside and light it)

We had a beautiful array of illuminated pumpkins at the end, and there was still time for a delicious tea of hot dogs [with onions of course], with cake and fruit to follow.

The next Messy Church on Saturday 6th December at 3pm, will be the Christmas Party with games, Christmas crafts and a special party tea! All the children of Alveley and Quatt are invited, with a parent or carer. There is no charge but all donations are welcome.

SUSTAINABILITY

Plans for Sustainable Bridgnorth's Green Festival are coming together, and the organising committee is hard at work to bring this event to life. Set to take place in late May 2026 at the Castle Gardens again, the festival will once more showcase local eco and conservation groups to raise awareness about climate and environmental issues. Next year, the group also aims to promote sustainability through quarterly themes that tackle pressing environmental challenges with engaging speakers and events designed to spark community action! One current initiative is with the Bridgnorth Litter Pickers, who are tracking litter from McDonald's to gauge the impact of the new store opening. Although Bridgnorth based, everyone is encouraged to report litter sightings in the village by messaging their Facebook page, to give a picture of the wider impact.

As I type this, COP30 is happening in Brazil while Storm Claudia hits us. This important gathering is hoping to tackle the urgent need for climate action in the face of rising global challenges like droughts, wildfires, storms and floods. With a focus on innovative climate finance and actionable solutions, COP30 aims to rally businesses, civil society, and governments to effectively combat climate change.

The UK government's commitment to phase out animal testing has been hailed as monumental for animal welfare, while new technologies are being deployed that benefit science humanely. Meanwhile, nature conservation and success stories have sparked optimism. After an absence of more than a century, pine martens are roaming Exmoor national park again. On the Isle of Wight, a tiny, orange-legged critically endangered wolf spider species, last recorded in 1985, was recently rediscovered. Meanwhile, off the Welsh coast, a "living reef" is emerging where 50,000 native oysters have been introduced to restore the seabed.

On a broader scale, the EU's decision to integrate climate education into school curriculums is seen as transformative for future generations. Despite warnings about global emissions, a surge in green technology investment signals a hopeful trend, while a Tropical Forests fund was established to compensate countries for tropical forest preservation. In innovation, a paint has been unveiled by Australian scientists that cools buildings while harvesting dew, so the path toward a sustainable future appears increasingly promising.

In the twenty-two years I spent as headteacher of comprehensive schools I was invited to countless nativity plays by our feeder primary schools. It was always an enjoyable experience and I was usually left wondering if there were any tea-towels left for the washing up! Children had excited (or worried) faces, proud parents and grandparents were waiting for their child's appearance or, better still, speech. There were some wonderful lines. Those I particularly remember were 'Hail Mary for thou art highly flavoured' and the wise man who presented his gift saying: 'Frank sent this.'

We will be spending Christmas at our daughter's in mid-Wales but will make sure that we have supplies in at home in case bad weather makes it impossible. I heard recently that the German government has advised its citizens to stock up for Christmas, too - with sausages and cheese. It's clearly a Wurst Käse scenario!


