

Beautiful Cypress Bend Park Pavilion on Toledo Bend Lake was the scene of the 11th annual TBLA BASS Unlimited Banquet and Auction on April 19, 2013. The event marked the culmination of Toledo Bend Lake Association's (TBLA's) major fundraiser for projects to improve the Lake and benefit the surrounding community.

More than 650 spirited TBLA members and community supporters gathered to enjoy a beautiful sunset and cool Spring weather, the traditional steak dinner, visit with friends, and bid on both silent and live auction items. The Banquet is a much-anticipated annual event where good friends, families, and lake supporters gather to contribute to TBLA's mission by purchasing banquet tickets, raffle tickets, prize tickets for drop boxes, and TBLA memorabilia. The crowd was welcomed by Ned Goodeaux, Banquet Coordinator, and Ted Dove, TBLA President, who asked for a moment of silence for the victims of the terror attack in Boston and for the town of West, Texas, as they heal from their tragedies.

During the evening, door prizes were given away, bids were taken for silent auction items, a live auction was conducted, and everyone waited anxiously to see if their ticket was drawn for the major prizes.

TBLA board member Mike Randolph served as Emcee of the banquet and introduced Kevin McDonald, master auctioneer, to conduct the live auction. Ricky Yeldell, Jarrett Thaxton, Sean Kinney, and Villis Dowden, all of the Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries, served as spotters to identify bidders. Items sold during the live auction brought in \$13,240. Two "card raffles" added \$2,080, and the silent auction garnered more than \$2,500. A Hummingbird 898c high definition GPS/Sonar depth finder brought in more than \$2,000 as a special raffle. It was won by Keith Powers of Alexandria. The grand prize raffle for a 2013 Polaris Ranger 800 ATV Side by Side, valued at more than \$10,000, was won by Kevin Simmons of Stonewall.
