MCPS Kindergarten Registration is Happening Now!

MCPS elementary schools need to know if your child will be attending their school in September. To register your child, call your local elementary school. It is very helpful to the elementary schools to know the number of children attending in the fall as soon as possible. Based on projected enrollments your child's elementary school may need to add another class, add another teacher, increase class size, and/or close a class. While your child won't start school until September the elementary schools are already making their staffing projections for the fall.

BHPCNS REMINDERS AND UPDATES:

BHPCNS Playgrounds: The BHPCNS playgrounds are open to the public. We love that our cubs play on the playgrounds throughout the year. We ask that you return the playground the way you found it, covering sandboxes and putting away the sand toys is very much appreciated.





Hand Washing Prevents the Spread of Germs: A quick reminder to wash your child's hands as they enter school every morning. We had a lot of sick children and staff in March. Many cases of the flu and strep have been reported to the office. Please help keep everyone healthy by washing your child's hands when you enter the school. Thank you! If your child is sick, please contact the office in the morning.

Reminder, a child must be healthy, without pain medication or fever reducing medicine, for 24 hours before they are allowed to return to school to prevent the spread of germs.

No Parking in the Fire Lane: The yellow line between the sidewalk and the driveway is to keep cars from drifting onto the sidewalk. This is also a fire lane. Parking is not allowed on this strip of pavement. Please park in a parking space when dropping children off in the morning or collecting them in the afternoon. Please share this information with everyone who drives your child.





Boots for Outdoor Playtime: Please continue to send your children to school with boots that can be worn outside to the playgrounds. Muddy playgrounds will not be keeping us indoors as the temperature rises!

Lost and Found Bin: The Lost and Found bin, by Room 117, is getting filled with warm jackets, hair bows, sweaters, and other lost items. Please check the bin for any missing belongings. Uncollected items will be donated to needy children in April.






Music Class 2s, 3s, & 4s

Scientist Delfin Reports:

This month in science we will explore the science of sound. We will learn how sound travels by vibrations called sound waves. We will vibrate rubber bands, jump ropes and paper to show sound waves in action and watch particles of sand dance on a speaker. We'll discover pathways for sound travel using the old-fashioned telephone on a string and learn about echos and echolocation through a game of Marco Polo.

Mrs. Stevens Reports:

Music ignites all areas of child development and skills for school readiness, including intellectual, social-emotional, motor, language, and overall literacy. It helps the body and mind work together. Although people have always been instinctively attracted to music, modern research is showing us how music education and exposure can have a profound effect on your preschooler's development. In one recent study, researchers found that music education is a great way to teach preschoolers *e*motional regulation. This is the term used to describe how children manage emotionally challenging environments. A child with well-developed emotional regulation is better able to deal with stress, changes,

Happy Spring! The children flapped their blue bird, ladybug, and butterfly wings, buzzed like bees, and hopped like frogs to the song "Spring Is Here." Sra. Cardoni Reports:

We will begin April singing about verbs and mimic the movement with a song by Sra Sara—Pizza Pizza Daddy O. We learn many new verbs (swim-nadar, walk-caminar, paint-pintar, sleep-dormir, etc.). Mid-month we begin a lesson on animals. We will sing the Itsi Bitsi Araña and Los Pollitos (a song sheet will be sent home). We will practice speaking to each other, learn what to say when meeting new people and learn how to ask someone's name and age. We will continue to review all of the words and songs we've learned thus far!

Ms. Casey Reports:

Spring is finally here! Thanks to warmer climates (and chasing after leprechauns!) the children are alternately bursting with energy and exhausted! It's a lovely combination that affords the kids the attention to learn new songs, dance, and alternately lay down on the ground and actively listen to Louis Armstrong and Bob Marley, to name a few. Our 2s are shifting from tandem to interactive play and music is a natural conduit that brings them together. The 3s continue to tackle the large catalog and wide variety of songs and gestures from our school "playlist." I'm so very proud of them. Our 4s are learning more complex songs with alternating verses. They're also learning some ASL (American Sign Language) to augment their songs! Combining motor skills with singing improves memory, strengthens communication skills and encourages self-expression.
