<u>F / G Seminar – Saturday 13th March</u>

On the 13th March a successful F / G Seminar was held at Cromwell Park with Judge Educator Barrie Stratton. Thank you to Claire Nitschke, Mary Nitschke, Lizzie Ritchie and Tamsin Adcock for volunteering to ride the demonstration tests in the afternoon.

The Seminar was enthusiastically received by both new and current Judges on the path to upgrading. There were twelve attendees at the Seminar, either working toward becoming G-Level Judges or on the path to upgrading. Dressage Test Debriefing

We've all been there. Disappointed with our dressage scores after a day out competing and feeling a little lost as to what went wrong. So, what can we do to debrief and really understand what the judges are trying to convey to us?

While there are the standard steps we all take, what are some further options available to us as competitors? Of course, watching footage of the test is one of the most valuable tools at our disposal, but not everyone is lucky enough to have a helper or friend available to record all our tests. So, we go straight to the test sheets and read the scores and associated comments, but what if we still aren't sure exactly what we need to work on for better marks next time?

Most of us are aware of the Training Scale requirements and probably see certain words repeated on our tests over time, but in order to understand what is required in a certain movement, the FEI handbook and test criteria should also be consulted. And of course, the Judges themselves and the Judges' own training tools are available to all riders.

To illustrate, let's use the example of riding an Elementary test for which the scores were lower than expected, and in particular the movement of shoulder-in received a low mark. Shoulder-in first appears in the lower levels at Elementary and is required all the way to the FEI tests, however the main criteria for the movement remain the same. Additionally, in some tests, this movement is subject to a co-efficient, meaning that a poor mark will count double and really hurt the final score.

Read the Judges' Comments

Was there an error in the way the movement was ridden - not enough angle, tending to leg yield or lacking bend? Or was it the quality of the pace that was affected - losing impulsion and flow, or dropping the poll? Or was there a recurring comment about the overall way of going throughout the test - needing improved collection for this level or to be more through or supple in general?

Read the test purpose

This can be found at the top of the test and will give a general overview of the requirements at that level. In an Elementary test, this would be "to confirm that the horse demonstrates correct basics, and having achieved the thrust required in Novice, now accepts more weight on the hindquarters (collection); moves with an uphill tendency, especially in the medium paces; and is reliably on the bit. A greater degree of straightness, bending, suppleness, throughness, balance and selfcarriage is required than at Novice Level."

Read the directives

In a shoulder-in, the directive next to the movement explains "Angle, bend and balance; engagement and quality of trot" are the main qualities and will therefore be what the judge is looking to reward.

Read the FEI Handbook

This demonstrates the qualities that Judges look for in each pace and every movement.

The essentials of shoulder-in are:

- Quality of the trot maintaining rhythm & impulsion
- Constant angle of 30 degrees, horse travelling on 3 tracks
- Correct & consistent bend
- No crossing of the hind legs (leg yielding)
- Elastic & steady contact with poll the highest point
- Collection, balance and fluency

The Judge must take all of the above into account in awarding a single mark and comment, with limited time and space. There is an explanation for each mark for each movement in the handbook, so it is an extremely useful tool.

In awarding a 6 - Satisfactory mark, the Judge will have considered the following in marking a shoulder-in:

- Precision: The trot needs more cadence, accuracy problems such as not being marker to marker, or incorrect angle
- Rhythm: Slight interruption to rhythm, some lack of freedom, tending to hurry
- Suppleness: more elasticity
- Contact: slightly tilted or contracted neck, poll not highest point
- Impulsion: tending to hurry or slow down needing more impulsion
- Straightness: more consistent bend, too much neck bend
- Collection: more engagement and uphill tendency, flat or on the forehand, laboured
- Submission: obedient but more ease & fluency

Talk to the Judge

There is of course limited time during a test for comments to be made, so the opportunity to discuss further with the Judge should be considered, by asking specific questions and taking the test sheet along for the conversation.

Go to your Coach

The judges' marks and comments outline what is required for higher marks and the coach can then explain how to achieve this.

Attend a Judges' Seminar

These Seminars are designed to demonstrate to the Judges what to look for in a test at a certain level and how to score accordingly so that the riders understand what is required of them. They are also a really helpful exercise for riders, as they break down the thought process that goes into giving each mark and show what is required for achieving higher marks.

Volunteer to Pencil at a Competition

Pencilling for a Judge can be extremely helpful in learning what they look for, consider in their comments and how they mark. Watching several tests live while the scores and comments are delivered can really help in understanding what is most important in each movement.

Our sport is of course subjective, however there are extensive guidelines on how dressage is to be judged, from the training scale which underlies all dressage training to more specific requirements for particular movements as set out in the tests themselves and the FEI Handbook. The Judges' comments should be the most helpful part of the test feedback, explaining what they would like to see to award a higher mark.

While every mark awarded and the final score are the opinion of the Judge, this opinion is highly qualified and the result of many hours over years of training and practice. Judges sit exams with the most experienced in the country to upgrade to the level they are qualified to judge and must demonstrate the necessary competence and confidence before gaining accreditation at that level.

If you would like to consider becoming a Judge yourself, there is information available on the ESA website, or contact the SA Dressage Judges Sub-committee. There is currently a small but dedicated group of dressage Judges in SA who are always eager to talk to anyone wanting to find out more. Happy riding.

What a great opportunity for some of our Amateur Owner Riders to have experienced this wonderful day. With such enthusiasm the timeslots sold out more quickly than anticipated and with such great feedback and support we are very likely to have another day like this!

It was a lovely calm day at MCDC. All who came began by performing their nominated test in front of their selected Judge / Mentor. Then it was back to the float with your horse, just like a competition setting. The test was then scored and the rider came to the office to have a 15 minute sit down with test in hand. This gave the Judge and rider the opportunity to discuss what may have been ridden better in their tests and possible techniques to help with how to improve things. Then it was back to the float to saddle up again and re-ride the test. This time it was more like a mini lesson. These sessions were thirty minutes long and the Judge was now able to stop you and pick out parts of the test. This gave riders the opportunity to then either correct movements or have a discussion of what they might need more or less of, gain a better understanding of what the Judge was seeing and learn what was needed to ride the movement correctly.

This was a great opportunity for riders to bring out a young horse who had not been to a competition as a few on the day did, or for riders getting back out there after a long break. It was lots of fun, making it a much more relaxed setting than on a competition day. This allowed the fear of the rectangle to subside and riders got some lovely work out of their horses. It's important to support our AOR community and with this support, to encourage others to progress further in the sport. I think days like these will really help to do this. Especially those of us in regional SA! Thank you to all the Committee members who helped out on the day and a special thanks to the Judges / Mentors who came out to give some awesome feed back to our AORs! Thank you also to MCDC for allowing us to use their wonderful grounds.

F.10.2 Etiquette for the warm-up arena

As there are many horses warming up in a restricted area it is important that all riders have knowledge of the etiquette required in group riding. This ensures safe riding and achieves harmony in busy areas.

- a) safety is paramount and a collision should be avoided at all times
- b) before entering the warm-up area make sure the gateway and immediate track are clear
- c) riders should pass left shoulder to left shoulder when on the outside track
- d) when not on the outside track, eg. on a diagonal line, riders should give way to horses on their left
- e) the more progressive gait has priority on the track (e.g. horses trotting should give way to horses cantering)
- f) a halt should not be on the track walking should not be on the track and does not have right of way
- g) trot has priority over walk
- h) canter has priority over trot
- i) lateral work has priority over all paces
- j) when circling, anticipate your return to the track so as to not stop the flow of other riders
- **k)** mounting, dismounting and gear adjustment should be done off the track
- I) consideration should be given to behaviour of other horses in the arena that may upset your horse
- m) it may be necessary to leave the area if your horse is upsetting others
- n) if a horse is upsetting the majority, an Official should be sought with a view to requesting that horse's removal for safety's sake
- o) be aware of stallions wearing green stallion discs.

4.6.1 Amateur Owner Rider (AOR)

Amateur Owner Rider (AOR) is a division of Official Competitive riders. The intent of the division is to highlight and reward non-professional riders. For the purposes of this Rule, a professional is someone who derives an income from activities in equestrian sport including breaking, training, coaching or riding horses. It does not however exclude riders who may also earn a living running an agistment property, work in the racing industry or at a saddlery for example. It is more about recognising riders with their own horses only to ride and train who are obliged to earn an income to support their sport outside of riding, coaching and training. All Amateur Owner Riders must meet the following criteria:

- a) the rider must be a Competitive member of their State branch of Equestrian Australia
- b) the horse must have a life registration with Equestrian Australia
- c) the horse / pony registration lodged with Equestrian Australia must reflect the name of the Amateur Owner Rider as owner or part-owner of the horse. Leased horses are eligible if the Amateur Owner Rider competitor is reflected as the lessee on the EA horse registration of that horse
- d) the rider's income may only include sponsorship and occasional payment for coaching. The horse / pony must be primarily ridden and trained by the rider / owner with only periodic ridden assistance by person(s) other than the owner, specifically during the period 4 weeks prior to the event
- e) the rider must be aged 21 and over can enter in the calendar year in which they turn 21
- f) the division is for Official Competitive competitions. The Organising Committees may run this division at any level (ideally at all levels Preliminary GP) and it can be run either within the competition or separately
- g) Organising Committees must designate the AOR on the draw if there is a separate competition conducted within the one competition
- h) for a State / Regional /Club Leaderboard it would be ideal to select several events at which scores will count towards the annual Leader Board
- i) if the OC receives evidence that the rider is in breach of these Rules then this rider will forfeit any awards and prizes.

Training Days

Our first training day of the year was on the 30th January 2021. We were fortunate to have two instructors, Naomi Mashford instructing flatwork and Greg Trembath coaching flatwork and poles. Both instructors were new to MCDC, and the places for both the private and group lessons sold out within a week. Almost universally, riders reported improvement in their riding and/or horse performance, and hopefully some riders will further their ambition and confidence to enter dressage tests with their horse. There was a wide range of horses from green broken, being re-trained to seasoned dressage performers. It is a credit to all our instructors that they got to know and work with new horses and riders in a short time. The second Arena Open Day was also held on this day, and three of the arenas were booked from 8.30-12.30pm. We were fortunate in having a cool day, it was beautiful for riding and it was really good to see the grounds being used by Club members.

We were again fortunate to have Interstate coach Wendy Barker instruct the day after the Dawn and Dusk competition on Sunday 28th February. Wendy is a NCAS Level 2 Dressage Coach and NCAS Coach Educator, and well as an EA A Level Dressage Judge and FEI 4* PE Dressage Judge. Wendy has been judging and coaching at MCDC for the past few years and has always been very popular, and this was again the case with all lessons selling out quickly. The weather was stunning and it was lovely to see a few new faces at the Training Day, as well as our regular riders. It was also good to see that our updated format of providing the option of private lessons as well as the traditional group lessons is proving popular. The feedback from the day was fantastic, and it was wonderful to see the improvement in the riders during their lessons.

We also had EA Level 2 General Coach and EA Coach Educator / Assessor Tamsin Adcock on Saturday 20th March and it was a great day for all our members. We had a mix of private and group lessons with polework and flatwork on offer.
