Protect Life

The tapestry scene may not seem to have much to do with the readings, yet it does. Let me explain: This wall-size work of art depicts the murder decreed by Herod of all the children two years and under. It was his desperate effort to extinguish any possibility that the Messiah might eventually contest his throne.

The reading of James could very well be applied to the greedy and avaricious Herod. "You have lived on earth in luxury and pleasure; you have fattened your hearts for the day of [your own] slaughter" (James 5:5). All the wealth, authority, and success he had only led him to be more grasping and insecure. Anyone who sees a threat to his own well-being in the birth of a child reveals his own internal poverty of spirit.

Rather than remove the little ones from our lives, we should do all we can to edify and maintain their faith. Jesus, as well as James, has harsh words for anyone who would lead a little one to sin.

Herod was the first who needed to hear the words of the Messiah he was trying to silence. If anything causes you to sin, even something as precious as a hand or foot, it's better to cut it off and live physically impaired rather than maintain apparent wholeness while spiritually rotting from within. The life of our souls and that of the little ones is of paramount importance, and no material security should be placed ahead of it.

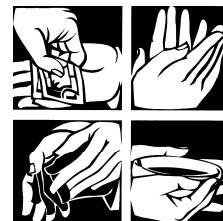

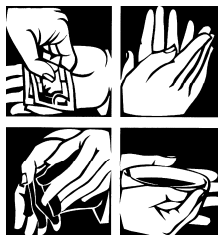

Daily Prayer

A regular way of reporting
some important news today
is to cite the source:

"according to a highly placed
government official," even
when the source is anony-
mous. We give the story
credibility if it seems to come
from an authoritative source,
deserving credibility. Jesus
tells us clearly that the
source of his message and
his power is God, the Father,
himself.

This week we can experi-
ence intimacy with God in
the midst of our busy lives if
we take brief moments
throughout our day, every
day, to let the connection
between ourselves and God
become conscious. We forget
who we are. We get distract-
ed by the world around us,
even with things that are our
duty, or commitment. To be-
come more conscious of the
presence of God with us in
our busy days takes some
practice. It is a matter of de-
sire and choice. If we desire
it, we will choose it. And, it
takes a "method."

This week we can wake
each morning and let our
first thoughts turn to our
Lord and our relationship.
"Good morning, Lord. Thank
you for letting me be your
disciple today. Help me to be
connected with you through-
out this day. With your love,
help me to be freer and more
grateful, in the midst of the
anxiety and tension I experi-
ence today." That takes less
than 30 seconds to say. We

might object, saying "I am just barely awake when I wake up. How am I supposed to think this clearly immediately?" It just takes practice. The point isn't to focus on the words, but on the relationship that frames our day. Then, in the shower, while getting dressed, getting to work, and at a dozen in between times throughout the day and evening, we can re-connect consciously, in an ongoing conversation - 20 or 30 seconds at a time.

"Be with me in this next challenge, Lord. I often lose my temper here. I can get fairly impatient at this time. I get hooked and slip into judgment and anger. Stay with me and I will rely on your grace to be more patient, gentle and loving." Or, walking down the hall to the restroom, I might say, in my heart, "Lord, it really helps me to remember that beyond my job description, I'm your disciple. Help me to listen to you. Help me sense I'm here to let your Kingdom enter the world here. Give me the help to bring healing and love in this place today."

Try to take a brief few moments while getting ready for bed to recall the moments of connection and grace this day and give thanks.
