REACH of Cherokee and Graham County, Inc. is an outreach program for victims of domestic violence. List of programs the organization supports are posted on the bulletin board in the hallway.

As the staff travel to the schools to discuss domestic violence, they have identified a need for children's shoes, underwear, and socks of varying sizes. If you have items of clothing (clean and in good condition), children's books, etc. to donate please place them in the blue bin located in the pantry. Check out the clearance section at Walmart and other stores next time you go shopping.

Stacy can always use some **small tote bags** and small travel size items to fill them with, e.g. travel size shampoo and conditioner, toothbrushes, tooth paste, travel size deodorant, hand sanitizer, etc. **Place items on the table located in the pantry on your left as you enter.**

Please contact the REACH office staff if you have furniture you want to donate to arrange pickup by the Thrift Store volunteers. They also ask for cooking utensils to help victims start over. Often the victims leave home with only the clothes on their back, so they are given clothes, furniture, and items for the home and clothes from the Thrift Store until they can get back on their feet. They also can use items to help with their self-esteem and pass the time until they can be placed in a safe environment. You can provide puzzles (500 pieces or less), adult coloring

books, reading material, word puzzles, make -up, nail polish, hair clips, etc.

Reach is leading our community in eliminating domestic violence and sexual assault through education, advocacy, self-empowerment, and community awareness.

FOOD BANK DONATIONS

We haven't been able to use the pantry because of the boxes stored but if you have an item to donate just give them directly to Lula and she will take them to the Cherokee County Food Bank, Inc. in Andrews, NC. The food bank is open to the public on Tuesdays and Saturdays from 10-12.

Most of the clients are homeless and/or senior citizens living on a fixed income, so they can use small bottles of laundry detergent to wash their clothes, hygiene items, e.g. shampoo & conditioner, toothpaste, soap or body wash, etc. Lula also includes assorted chips and crackers to give to the homeless who sit outside next to the food bank. The food bank has a bakery that donates bread, and the local Walmart provides fresh produce.

You can also write a check payable to the Andrews Food Bank, P. O. Box 843, Andrews, NC 28901, and they will supplement items that are not being donated.

Today we will be studying Mark 4 -6.

We have resumed 6:00 PM **evening devotional.** If you have a special request, please let Roy Stephenson know.



On Wednesday evening, April 30, we will begin a study on discipleship with the help of the book, "Turning Church Members into Disciple Makers." It will be a four-month study and we will discuss one chapter per week. This will not be a lecture. but a discussion of what we read in each chapter led by Roy Goodlet. Everyone will need a copy of the book. Here are different options on how to obtain one. Amazon sells it new for \$14.99, or you can get the Kindle version for \$2.99. College Press sells it new for \$11.99. You can get a used book on Ebay for about \$8.50.

A distorted view of God will keep your friends and family from hearing or accepting the gospel. This book reveals the eleven spiritual profiles found in the book of Acts, how to correct their particular distortion of God, and then how to share the good news. This book is divided into two sections: (1) God's Purpose for Every Christian and (2) Engaging My Neighborhood with Good News. The first section defines

God's purpose for every believer. Turning members of the church into disciple makers begins with the member understanding and embracing his or her new identity in Christ. Jesus said, "I will build my ekklesia (church)" (Matthew 16:18). Members are Christ's body, his "called out ones to be trained to do God's work." Christ empowers the members of his body with his Holy Spirit to expand his kingdom family by sharing the gospel. Those added to the ekklesia are to be equipped to make more disciples. We are to continue the process until Jesus returns. The second section moves the disciple makers into the neighborhoods to fulfill their purposes and make disciples within their circles of influence. Sharing the gospel message can be a little complicated. There's more to it than just telling somebody what the gospel is and how to respond. Each person has his or her own baggage— cultural, intellectual. and emotional barriers—that need to be removed before the simple gospel can take root in the heart.
