Designing educational displays and meeting the public are key to the success of Wind River Raptors. We give many presentations annually. These range from kindergarten kids to college environmental science students, art shows to public and private events. We talk about what Wind River Raptors does and why we do it. We tailor presentations based on the audience, venue, and what has been requested.

Education volunteers are well-studied and have an incredible breadth of knowledge about many topics related to raptors.

Below are the basic requirements for our educational volunteers:

- Have the time to volunteer to design programs, give programs, study, understand, and articulate information to the general public
- Successfully pass the Wyoming falconers exam
- Be 18 years of age
- Have attended five presentations as an assistant
- Demonstrate a commanding knowledge of raptors
- Know and understand the mission and purpose of Wind River Raptors
- Have a minimum of 20 hours of experience handling educational birds under supervision
- Be able to perform and discuss all the care and maintenance needs for our educational raptor ambassadors.
- Understand and demonstrate the use of all equipment used in handling educational raptor ambassadors
- Understand the deep history of falconry in this country and throughout history
- Understand and articulate the important roll falconry has played in the preservation of wild raptors
- Understand and articulate the vital roll falconry has played in the formation and success or Wind River Raptors
- Attended two falconry hunts
