Parish social ministry responds to human needs, whatever and wherever they may be, whether with parishioners or other members of the community, whether the need be hunger, housing, illness, loneliness, employment, fair wages, physical disabilities or ecological sustainability. Parish social ministry must respond to issues of respect for human life at every stage of existence. We must encourage broad group action on behalf of those who hunger for righteousness and peace. However it is done, parish social ministry needs to be organized and deliberate. It must be communal, planned and directed by a group, and not a simple individual response.

10 Ways to "address catechesis at all life stages and circumstances"

- 1. Design an events-centered curriculum so that the formation for all members of the community flows organically from the feasts and seasons, the lectionary, and the meaningful special events of your own parish – and all members of each household are engaging the same topics at their respective levels.
- 2. Parishioners still describe the bulletin as the primary way they learn about the life of the parish - make it the best formation and catechetical tool it can possibly be – plant in it some supports for family faith-sharing and for personal spiritual growth.
- Start a tradition of "individualized formation plans" - where each member or household renews their formation goals annually (maybe during Lent?) and the parish provides guidance and resources suited to these goals (website pages for target groups or topics?).
- Establish a creative team whose job is to ensure that every parish activity bringing people together for any reason has a catechetical dimension - make a sport of it!
- Train and equip parish catechists to make sure that something from every lesson "spills over" into the home and that life at home connects back to the next week's lesson.
- Find and warmly invite your senior members into the catechetical process – think of all the ways they can enrich such experiences as RCIA sponsoring and hospitality, catechist support,

- witness talks, parenting support, prayer partners and mentors, and...
- 7. Create "faith families" within your parish community – smaller multi-generational clusters (maybe 12-25 members) who commit to supporting each other's faith journey. Give each "family" a scrapbook-type journal and challenge (with guidance) their creative path through a full liturgical cycle together.
- In the context of a fun family-oriented parish social, invite the Confirmation candidates or youth group members to "interview" the parish elders about key elements of the gospel message and how they have been called to live it out over their years. Stage this in a way that all present can hear and observe, since the in-between generation will especially benefit.
- Consider the VLCFF courses on lifelong faith, such as: Parish as a Learning Community; Designing a Parish Catechetical Plan; Designing and Implementing Adult Learning and Faith Formation (and many other choices) – anyone in the Diocese may enroll in these courses for the reduced "Diocesan Partner" rate.
- 10. Enroll all of your parish catechetical leaders in some of the upcoming workshops: Catechist Camp, Fulfilling the Vision, and Fall Convocations all described in this issue of News Notes.
