Tidings of Hope

Our purpose is to glorify God by worshipping, witnessing, teaching, loving and serving our Lord, Jesus Christ.

Dear Hope Family:

We are in the middle of summer – but closer to Labour Day than the last day of school and graduation. I have been your pastor for 18 months and 23 days, and I want to point out something I have noticed that is probably obvious to you. Or maybe it's something that you have not noticed or thought about. Whichever it is for you, I have noticed this: Hope Lutheran Church really does great things for kids.

We just did VBS (Very big stumps? Verified bear sightings? Very best student?) and there were 50 kids from age 3 to 11. 50! That may not match the glory days of 150 attending when some of us were kids, but it was 50 kids we loved on, got messy with, played games with, taught Bible to, and sang songs about Jesus with.

And it was about 700 volunteers - the Youth and Family committee choosing a curriculum and lining up volunteers, weeks and months ahead making decorations (and I am looking at you, Sarah), registering kids, making name tags, serving food, teaching crafts, teaching bible, leading opening and closing, playing games and running around, herding kids from one place to another – like herding cats! - fixing owies, cleaning up, loving on these little ones. And parents hear and see that love and that message through their kids.

And during the school year, Hope feeds breakfast to the sports teams each Thursday morning. Steve buys the food, people get here at 6 in the morning to make pancakes, fling cinnamon on french toast, cook up sausage, set out the plates and silverware and cups of juice and butter and syrup, greet the kids, lead devotions, and clean up, dishes done, tables wiped, and all done by 8:30am.

And Friday School. I had never heard of this in all of my 67 years. Friday school teachers faithfully here, teaching, leading, listening to, and loving on kids, for K to 8th grade.

And all of this on top of regular Sunday School. Wow. Just wow.

This is from the life of Jesus, as recorded in Mark 10:13-15: And they were bringing children to him that he might touch them, and the disciples rebuked them. But when Jesus saw it, he was indignant and said to them, "Let the children come to me; do not hinder them, for to such belongs the kingdom of God. Truly, I say to you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God like a child shall not enter it." And he took them in his arms and blessed them, laying his hands on them.

Well done, Hope Lutheran! Keep it up.
