Theme: Wisdom and the Demands of Discipleship

In a computerized society we stress the value of planning and calculation. The computer helps the human mind to make quick and prudent decisions. Does calculation have a place in interhuman relationships, or, on a higher level, in the way human beings decide to style their lives as related to God and religion? Biblical persons did not know the computer, but they did know about wisdom and prudence. Even if we speak of love, dedication, and faith, the element of prudence must be there! Intuitive and emotional decisions are sometimes feasible and even heroic. But, as a rule, we must sit down, apply wisdom and prudence, and even calculate our resources. The First Reading and Gospel deal with prudence and even calculation.

FIRST READING Wis 9:13-18b

[God's Counsel]

The Book of Wisdom addresses Jews living in Egypt (1st century B.C.). As a minority group, they were exposed to the Greek culture and philosophy of their time. Greek wisdom, which survives even in modern universities, endangered the Biblical wisdom Jews were supposed to follow. The author is convinced that we need wisdom and prudence, and as such this reading refers to today's Gospel. But he also stresses that real wisdom is a gift of God. It cannot be obtained by professional philosophers. We must beg God to give it. Do we pray for guidance when we are about to make an important decision? "Teach us to number our days aright, that we may gain wisdom of heart" (Responsorial Psalm).

SECOND READING Phim 9-10, 12-17

[Brothers in Christ]

In this letter, Paul, though himself in jail, intercedes for a runaway slave. Was this slave, Onesimus, a young teenager? Paul calls him "my child." Apparently, he had stolen something from his master. In any case, existence would be hard for this young man; if caught, he would receive the most severe punishment. Under the circumstances, in Paul's opinion, it was best to send him back.

The Nativity of Mary is a Christian feast day that celebrates the birth of Jesus’ mother, Mary. This holiday is also known as the Birth of the Virgin Mary, Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, and Marymas. Although biblical scripture doesn’t definitively record the birth of Mary, there is an account of her birth that can be found in the Protoevangelium of James—an apocryphal text from the second century.

Facts About the Virgin Mary

Mary Is Likely From the Tribe of Levi.

At the time of Mary, 1,500 years after Jacob, every Jew could trace their lineage back to one of the 12 sons of Jacob. Mary’s relatives were probably descended from Aaron, the first high priest of Israel and the brother of Moses.

Mary Offered Up Two Turtledoves

When Jesus was born, Joseph and Mary brought him to the temple in Jerusalem to consecrate him to God. This is when they offered two turtledoves. This could be a hint at the social class she was in. According to Leviticus, a mother was supposed to offer a 1-year-old lamb, otherwise known as a yearling lamb, and one turtledove. However, if the mother couldn’t afford to present a lamb, then they could bring two turtledoves. It might also be symbolic, considering that the second turtledove is called a sin offering—an offering specifically meant to cleanse away sin.

Customs, Traditions, and Observances

This feast day is observed in different ways all over the world. In France, local winemakers bring their best winegrowers to their church to be blessed and to attach some of the bunches to the hands of Mary’s statue. Grapes are also worked into the feast for the day in France.
