



## 10 Ways to Find Child Care

1. Call your local child care resource and referral agency for free referrals.  
(For one in your area go to [www.naccrra.org](http://www.naccrra.org))
2. Check your state child care licensing website for a list of providers in your area. You can often find detailed information about each facility, as well as check background history. Most sites will list licensed child care facilities only – child care centers, family child care homes, afterschool programs and summer camps.
3. Ask family and friends who they use. Find out what they like and dislike about the facility they are currently using.
4. Inquire with your co-workers.
5. Check with fellow church members. One of them may have a recommendation or might be willing to provide care for your child.
6. Use the internet to search local providers.
7. View Craigslist postings. Be sure to run a background check if you use this resource for finding a child care provider.
8. Ask your obstetrician for referrals.
9. Read free local parenting magazines for child care facility ads.
10. Call a local enhanced child care resource and referral company.
