BOOK REVIEWS

The Sandalwood Tree

Historical novels and books set in India have always been among my favorites so when I discovered <u>The Sandal-wood Tree</u> by Elle Newmark, I read it eagerly. The story is based upon two very important events in Indian history... the ending of the British Raj in 1947 and the Sepoy Rebellion in 1856-57. Evie and Martin move to India in 1947 for Martin to do doctoral research into the ending of the Raj. Evie discovers letters from the eighteenth century and sets out to find out more about the women who wrote them. The book is very well written with descriptions of life in India and an intriguing story line to solve the mystery of the letter writers. Newmark's character development is delightful, e.g. in describing women in the exclusive British Club she wrote "her voice could have grated carrots" and "her laughter sounded like glass shattering".

This story examines the Caste system, sexual orientation, religious differences, the idiosyncrasies of the Victorian period especially as it pertains to women, and the effects of war on a person's psyche. And there are poignant and moving love stories too!

<u>The Sandalwood Tree</u> is Newmark's first book but, unfortunately, she died in 2011. Her second and final book is <u>The</u> <u>Book of Unholy Mischief</u>, which is one that I will look forward to reading.
