

42. Further Description of Important Features (Continue on reverse if necessary) This is a traditional I-house with a central ridge, brick chimney. A rear one-story, gabled wing also has a central brick chimney. Windows are all 2/2 and shuttered. The front facade features a central doorway and shed roof porch with centered gable. The original porch was added after 1928 but removed and replaced in 1978. Its floral millwork trim was scavenged from the James Hamilton house on the island's north bay (now razed). 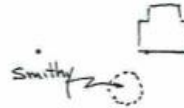

a narrow frieze, end, and water table boards. Interior features include: original sink and pump in kitchen (connected to cistern); original molded plaster ceiling medallion and oil lamp fixture; brass window and door hardware; steep, narrow interior stairway. There are no fireplaces and heating stoves are vented through central chimney.

by open, mowed lawn. To the north lies a scrub covered vacant lot and to the south the adjacent land also owned by Mr. Haas contains a remodelled barn and the building which once housed the first store of Fred Elfers and August Heckerman (See ERI-1626 for further description). A slight mound hidden in scrub to the east and rear of the house marks the site of the former smithy where steel plates and old tools have been found by Mr. Haas. A small modern log guest cottage lies to the east of this spot.

to the estate of the Bauman family where it remained until 1948. Edward, born on the island in 1858, was the son of Samuel and Bridget Bauman, who emigrated from Ireland in 1854 and settled on the island's east side (ERI-1635) as farmers and grape growers. Before his death, Edward helped on his father's farm. Various members of this family lived in the present house including a sister & brother, John, who died here in 1948. Some time after the house was built, a blacksmith shop was erected southeast of the house. It was considered the "village smithy" and was operated by several different smiths. The most well-known of these was Herbert Pringnitz, who was born on the island in 1883, and lived in the house of his parents, Henry and Elizabeth Pringnitz (ERI-1636) on the east side. Another occupant of the 1930's and 40's was Karl Miller who rented here before buying the Willaim Bauman house (ERI-1594). Born on the island, 1891, to Adam and Margaret Miller, he was a shovel operator for the KIL&T Co.
