

Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

Ascension Sunday

Year C

Luke 24:46-53

"As above, so below" OR "What goes up, also comes down"

Happy Ascencion! Jesus rises again, to be seated in glory at the Right Hand of the Father. Peter in his persuasive message on Pentecost preached, "God raised this Jesus; of this we are all witnesses. Exalted at the right hand of God...." (Acts 2:32-33). What does that mean, 'to be seated at the right hand of God'? Think of that statement as "Jesus is the 'right hand' of Father – the effective and authoritative expression of the Father. It's the "Hand" that gets things done, as it embodies in action, the mind and will of its owner. And to be the 'Right' Hand, that puts the dot on the "I"! This expression is very biblical, as we can find examples in Psalm 138:7 "You stretch out your hand, God; your right hand saves me" Also, in Isaiah 41:20, "That all may see and know...That the hand of the LORD has done this." Or in Exodus 15:6 "Your right hand, O LORD, magnificent in power, your right hand, O LORD, shattered the enemy." The 'Hand' accomplishes work (manifests one's will/ideas). Jesus steps right into that role of "God's Hand" even before He formally ascends in glory, when He announces "I came down from heaven not to do my own will, but the will of the one who sent me" (John 6:38). Jesus adds later, "I did not speak on my own, but the Father....commanded me what to speak" (John 12:49) And then in John 14:10, Jesus says that "The Father who dwells in me is doing his works." Jesus is the Will, Word and Work of the Father. This is why Jesus had told Philip, "If you see me, you see the Father!" (John 14:9). Taking up the *Hand Imagery* again in Luke 11:20, this is what Jesus meant when He told crowds, "If it is by the *finger of God* that I drive out demons, then the kingdom of God has come upon vou." So. Jesus is the visible extension of the Father's Will on Earth!

Jesus' ascension up to the glory of the Father, leads to the descent back down to us of the Holy Spirit, so that we His disciples may become the continued presence of the Will, Word and Work of God on earth ('on earth as it is in heaven')! In today's reading, Jesus counsels His disciples to trust and wait, for the Promise of the Father (Luke 24:49). What is that? The Father's Will. The Triumph of 1)Life, 2)Good and 3)Grace! Life Wins! Ultimately the Promise of the Father is Jesus' Resurrection-the vindication of Jesus. As the Son embodies the Father's Will announcing the kingdom of Human fulfillment, so, the Father raises up and restores the Son's work of human redemption. What is offered up in sacrifice, comes down in fruit born among us! Jesus ascends and the Spirit descends (Jn 1:51 "you will see the sky opened and the angels of God ascending and descending on the Son of Man") The Holy Spirit confirms the presence of Jesus for us – they both are One with Father. That's the rest of the story!

I like to point out where Luke says this Ascencion event occurs - at Bethany. Luke 24:50-51 reports that Then "Jesus led them out as far as Bethany, raised his hands, and blessed them......parting from them and was taken up to heaven." Why Bethany? Bethany was just outside of Jerusalem about two miles, and was often rest stop or area of respite for pilgrims as they were about to enter the Holy city Jerusalem. It was also where they would retreat to, for overnight stays-likely rent and the cost of living was a lot less outside of the big city-sound familiar? (Matt 21:17, Mk 11:1). More importantly, it is where Jesus' friends Martha, Mary and Lazarus lived (Lk 19:29, Jn 11:1), and where Lazarus was raised from the dead (Jn 11:18). Jesus *loved* to regularly eat and rest there (Luke 10:38–42). The name means, "House of Humility", "House of Call-Answer" or "House of Toil". A lot of something (Lazarus' resurrection action) and a lot of nothing (Mary lounging at Jesus' feet) went on there! It is where Jesus is served by both table service (Martha), eager listening (Mary) and occupational work (Lazarus). About Bethany, I also like to point out that Jesus "loved it" (John 11:15): A place of peace, work and rest with others! That's us as the Spirit returns to us! We wait and watch for the Holy Spirit to come upon us!
