Barn Owls: It Takes a Village

“It takes a Village” as they say, and this phrase certainly applies to the new Barn Owl nest boxes awaiting their final installations at the Historical Park. A pair of Barn Owls roosting in the Ferrando Barn were the nucleus for the project, which hopes to increase the number of Barn Owls at the park to help with sustainable pest management practices. Owls eat mice & rats, which we happen to have. A match made in heaven!

The project began last summer when a PG&E donation to REACH San Benito Parks Foundation allowed us to purchase plywood and plans to build eight boxes at the Historical Park McKinnon lumber cut the plywood per the awesomely detailed plans by the Hungry Owl Project plans.



Next, Araceli Rodriguez and Izel Prieto of Girl Scout Troop 23404 stepped up and volunteered to build the boxes for their Silver Award project.



And finally, SBCHS's VP John Wrobel and REACH Director Mark Paxton and mounted the first of the boxes on the Bunkhouse. It will be getting interpretive signage explaining the benefits of raptors such as these Barn Owls in our Parks. An Owl Cam may follow...please consider a donation! 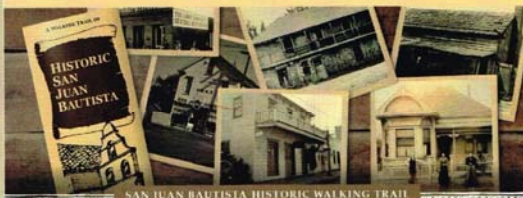
