to this Chapel Street house. Their property totalled 12 acres, mostly devoted to grapes. Paulin Riedy was one of a number of small island grape-growers who also manufactured wine during the late 1800's. Their market was primarily the many tourists who visited the island. Two sons of Paulin Riedy, Frank and Henry, followed their father's example and established a "basement" winery in a building on Division St., just south of the present Estes School (ERI-1610). This house was owned, later, by Henry _____ and rented to Adney and Wilma McKillips around 1914. It was occupied by "Smiley" Baumler in the 1920's.
