Please note that all distances are approximate and ascents are given as a guide to difficulty.

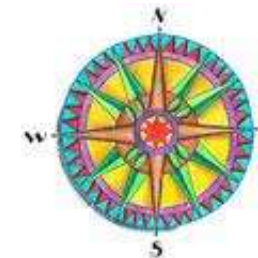
Children are welcome, but under 18s must be accompanied by a parent or guardian on all walks.
