

James Matthew Slay Jr. died peacefully in his home in Westminster, MD, on Saturday, September 6, 2025. He was 82.

Jim was known as a true gentleman, thoughtful of others, warm and generous-hearted, and devoted to his family.

MC: Col. Bill Parrish, USMC Ret.


HHS Veterans' Forum meets next on Tuesday November 11, 2025.

Location will be Goochland High School for their MCJROTC Veterans Day Celebration.

Speaker will be Col W.H. Parrish, USMC (Ret). His topic will be "What Veterans Receive during their service."

The Houston-Holicky-Sitter Veterans' Forum is an informal forum for veterans of all branches of the armed forces. Col. Joseph J. Holicky, Jr. (USMC, ret.) and Congressional Medal of Honor recipient Col. Carl L. Sitter (USMC, ret.) began having lunch together in the mid 1970's following their retirements. 
Marine Corps Reading
