In Memoriam RITA FLAHERTY (1935—2020)

Rita Flaherty, a member of Soroptimist International of Grosse Pointe (SIGP) for 33 years (1978-2011), donated \$1,251.84 through her estate. I am filled with gratitude that she thought to remember SIGP in her will.

Rita grew up in Chester, Pennsylvania, and earned a Bachelor of Science degree in education from West Chester State Teachers College in 1957. Shortly after graduation, she moved to Grosse Pointe Farms with her family. She taught fourth, fifth and sixth grades at Kerby Elementary School for more than 30 years.

Besides teaching elementary school children, Rita started a retail business. She owned and managed an educational supply store, The School Bell, for more than 10 years. She became a lifetime member of The Grosse Pointe Theatre and wrote and produced several plays. She was also committed to raising funds for Project Hope.

In 1978, Rita joined SIGP and remained an active member for 33 years. She attended monthly meetings, participated in fundraising events, and even attended an SI convention in Australia.

She then became involved in the Friendship Link program corresponding with one of the Soroptimists she met in Australia. She shared her love of the theatre with SIGP. Rita recruited many of us, including me, to perform in one of her plays. It was held at the Broadway Onstage Theatre in Eastpointe. Whether we were on stage or in the audience, we all enjoyed it.

We are grateful to Rita for her years of service as a Soroptimist as well as remembering our club in her will. Her donation will make a large difference helping to fund our awards, service projects, antihuman trafficking initiatives, international commitments, or a combination thereof.

She is survived by many loving friends and grateful parents and students who will miss her bright smile, generous spirit, and her love of teaching.

Thanks for your support. All money earned will go to our programs and scholarships.


