Ada I. Binder, age 92 of Pigeon, passed away Wednesday, August 22 at Scheurer Hospital Long Term Care in Pigeon.

She was born in Bad Axe on November 18, 1914, the daughter of the late Melvin and Grace (Wakefield) Dean, and attended the Wakefield School. On October 12, 1940 she was united in marriage to Arnold O. Binder in Colfax Township. He preceded her in death in 1951.

Mrs. Binder was a homemaker throughout her lifetime. She also worked at the Pigeon Cannery and at Scenic Convalescent Home for many years, as well as at the egg factory in Pigeon, and at Brown Egg Plant in Bad Axe.
