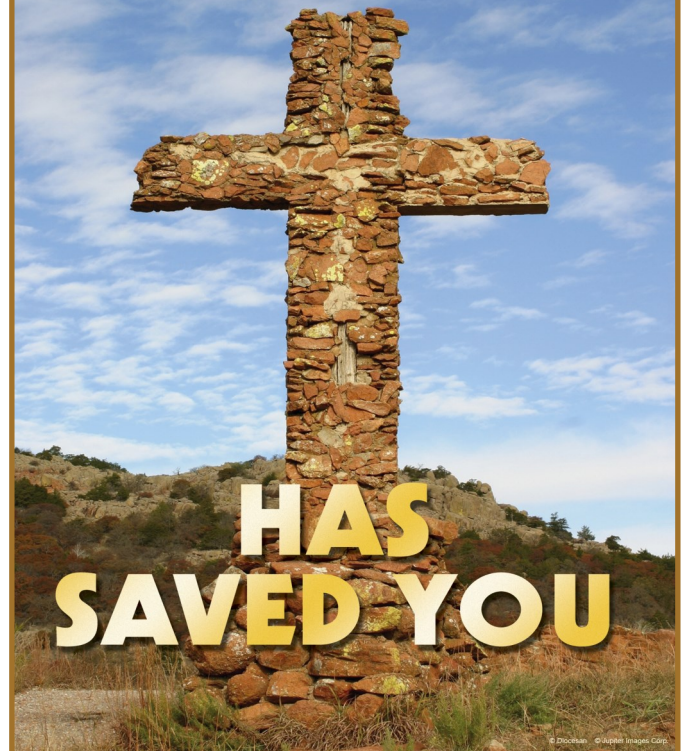

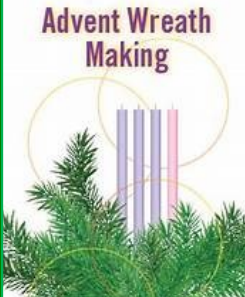

United in Prayer with the Missions As World Mission Month continues, we are invited not only to give but to pray for the Church in mission territories. One powerful way to do this is by praying the World Mission Rosary, introduced by Venerable Archbishop Fulton Sheen in 1951. Each decade is a different color, representing a region of the world. In Evangelii Nuntiandi, St. Pope Paul VI reminds us that prayer is the soul of all mission: "It is the Holy Spirit who, today just as at the beginning of the Church, acts in every evangelizer" (75). Through our prayers, we unite ourselves with missionaries bringing the Gospel to the ends of the earth. Let us offer our rosaries and Masses this week for those who bring Christ's love to the margins, often at great personal cost. And let us ask the Holy Spirit to rekindle the fire of hope in our own hearts, that we may also be missionaries, wherever we are.

They are located in Shippensburg and do free pregnancy testing, ultrasound confirmation appointments, pregnancy decision consultations and teach classes about pregnancy, childbirth, infant care and parenting.

They provide care through the child's second year.

Items needed:

Baby/toddler clothing, coats/snowsuits shoes & socks. Bibs, diapers & diaper bags, wipes, formula, cereal/baby food, and breast pump.

There will be a playpen in the back of church near the entrance to the Social Hall

They will also accept new or gently used baby furniture: Cribs/mattress, baby carrier, boppy/nursing pillow, car seat (**in date**), Stroller, highchair, pack-n-play, & swing.

You Are Invited Mass for the Loss of a Child

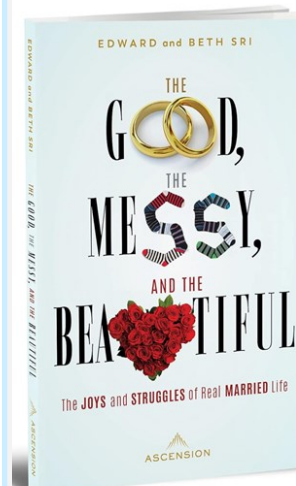


The loss of a child, regardless of what age he or she was at their death, is a devastating cross to bear. You do not need to bear it alone. Join us at St.

The Book of the Month for both September and October 2025 is **The Good, The Messy, and the Beautiful: The Joy and Struggles of Real Married Life** by Edward and Beth Sri. It makes sense that marriage is the fundamental structure and bedrock of society because it forms the family unit. However, sometimes we can override-

alized married life in the Catholic Faith while not being honest with the real struggles and challenges that married couples face with their spouses as husband and wife as well as with their potential children as well. The well-known Catholic speaker and author Dr. Edward Sri co-writes this book with his wife Beth, and it is easy to read, honest, filled with little stories and examples, and truly includes both perspectives of the good, the messy, and the beautiful within marriage. Every person can benefit from reading this book not only in a personal way for their own lives (even those who are not married...although I do believe it can be transformative for married couples!), but also because we need to try our best to support married couples striving to live this beautiful vocation within our Catholic Faith. The Word of God Alive: Discussing the Readings with your children

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells another parable about never being tired of praying. The characters in this story are a widow and a judge. In Jesus' time, widows were usually very poor and unimportant. They often needed the help of others when their husband died. When the widow came to the judge for help when she had been treated unfairly, this judge didn't care about her troubles. He ignored her. However, the widow did not give up pleading her case. Finally, the judge heard her case and made things right for her.

Jesus uses this story to remind us of what God is *not* like. Jesus reminds us that God loves us all and wants what is best for us.

Jesus is telling us not to give up when we pray, even if it seems like God is not hearing us. God does hear us and cares about what is happening to us and how we are feeling. We must be like the widow and not give up and have patience with God. Spending time in prayer helps us grow closer to God. And when we pray, we need to listen too.

Have you ever been with someone who didn't want to talk?

When that happens, we sometimes want to talk more. That can happen in prayer. Because we can't hear God's voice answer us, we might feel like we need to keep talking. But sometimes, when we try to be quiet, we can hear God in our hearts speaking to us.

Living our Faith: This week remember to pray each day. Try to spend some of your time with God just being quiet. Let God speak to your heart.



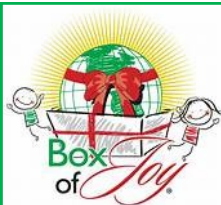
Inspired by Jesus' words, "I was in prison and you visited me," the Pastoral Ministry Team at Dauphin County Prison seeks caring and
