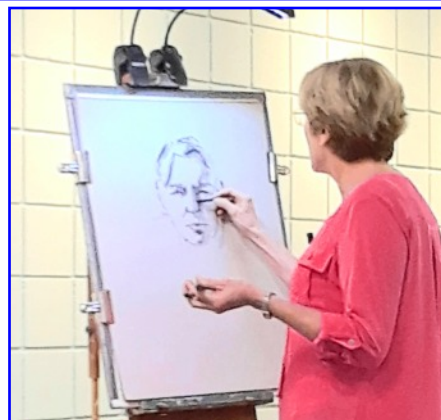

The skill and expert oversight of these curators has contributed to increased exposure and sales with over 12 sales in the first quarter of this year alone. 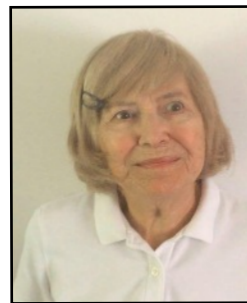

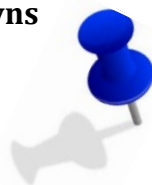
