<u>Toledo Bend Reservoir</u> – Daily Lake levels may be found at: <u>http://www.srala-toledo.com/</u>. The Lake level is currently approximately 170.2 ft. msl. SRA is generating 24 hours/day with both generators, and the fall seasonal draw down is beginning to happen.

Inquiries have been received from several TBLA members regarding rumors that the Sabine River Authorities of Louisiana and Texas are planning a significant drawdown of the lake in order to repair the spillway infrastructure. The spillway infrastructure below and above the dam were damaged during the record high lake level experienced in March 2016, when all operating spillway gates had to be opened almost to the maximum extent in order to protect the structural integrity of the dam. The rumors of a drastic drawdown range from 159' msl to 162' msl. Those drastic drawdown levels are not planned by Toledo Bend Project Joint Operations. The rumors are just that – rumors. On August 21, 2017 there was a meeting of the SRA/LA Public Relations Committee, which consists of Jim Pratt – SRA/LA Executive Director, Warren Founds – SRA/LA Deputy Director, Jim Mifflin – TBCAC President, Gary Moore – TBLA President and Eason Dowden – Realtor Representative. At that meeting, the SRA/LA outlined basic plans for repairs of the spillway. The repairs are estimated to cost approximately \$6 million with funding provided by the two Sabine River Authorities, the Toledo Bend Project insurance companies, the power companies (partners in the project -Entergy and Cleco), and the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). The repair plans and approval by FERC of those plans are currently underway. Final plans and bidding of the project are expected by the end of the year.

Preliminary schedules are estimating approximately eight to ten months to complete the repairs after the project is awarded to the successful bidder. One phase of the repair will require removal of all the rip rap protecting the area directly below the spillway concrete apron, exposing the soil to erosion from a spill. Protecting the project from spills during this time is critical to keep from further damaging the spillway and delaying the completion of the project. Depending on when the repair project gets started and at what stage the operating guide calls for reservoir levels to be at that time, will determine whether or not any change should be made relative to lowering the normal water level. Because the repair project will include a full year lake level cycle, scenarios are being developed to encompass historical inflow and outflow data to help with the decisions of if and when the reservoir would be lowered. Developing lake level scenarios will help determine the possibility of spilling water during those particular months the construction repair is planned.

The final repair project design from Freeze and Nichols Engineering, and their view of the urgency of the repair and period of time for repairs relative to the normal operation of the reservoir will ultimately help determine the need to lower the reservoir water level or not.

SRA/LA will make more detailed information available as they continue to work through the project.

Safety Awareness for the Lake – Stumps are showing, and many are just under the lake's surface. In the next month, more stumps will begin to show. Please wear your life jackets and use your kill switches as we see the danger from underwater obstructions grow with the falling lake level.
