ORDINANCE NO. <u>2024~ 2</u>

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING AUTOMOTIVE SALVAGE AND SCRAP DEALERS

BE IT ORDAINED by the President and the Board of Trustees of the Village of Chapin, Illinois as follow:

SECTION 1. No person or entity shall carry on within the corporate limits of the Village of Chapin the business of automotive parts recycler, a scrap processor, automotive parts recycler, a scrap processor, automotive salvage dealer, a repairer, or a rebuilder of salvaged vehicles. In addition, no person or entity within the corporate limits of the Village of Chapin shall engage in the act of dismantling, crushing, or altering a vehicle into another form using machinery or equipment.

This Section 1 shall not apply to any motor vehicle or motor vehicle accessories which are stored entirely within an enclosed building and out of view of the public.

SECTION 2. Any person violating any provision of Section 1 shall be fined an amount not less than \$75.00, but not more than \$750.00. Each day such violation is committed or permitted to continue, shall constitute a separate offense and shall be punishable hereunder as such. The Village shall be entitled to recover its reasonable attorney's fees and court costs associated with the enforcement of this ordinance. The penalties set forth in this ordinance shall be in addition to the Village's right to demand the abatement of the violation and/or to take legal action to abate the violation.

SECTION 3. The provisions and sections of this Ordinance shall be deemed to be separable, and the invalidity of any portion of this Ordinance shall not affect the validity of the remainder.

SECTION 3: All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby amended to conform with this Ordinance.

SECTION 4. The Village Clerk is hereby directed to publish this Ordinance in pamphlet form.

SECTION 5. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval, and publication as required by law.
