Lately, I have had trouble falling asleep, so my mind goes into "over drive" and I think about all sorts of things – including what I should or should not have done during the day, week, or years before. That spells "trouble" with a capital "T."

The fact that I could not dance and still cannot did not enter into it, but my wonderful mother listened and tried to console me.

Then there were those countless birthday parties when she would make "pigs in a blanket" not from crescent rolls in a can, but from yeast dough that she mixed herself.

Every year she made "stollen," Christmas and Easter cookies by the dozen, New Year's pretzel

### Hotel Millwright Wins Iowa Hotel Association Award

The Iowa Hotel and Lodging Association awarded Hotel Millwright the "Sustainability Award" recognizing "how sustainability and preservation can work hand in hand."

Hotel Millwright will be featured in a four-minute video shown at the industry conclave next week.

A feature article will be in the Iowa Hotel and Lodging Association magazine, "Iowa Hospitality Advocate" and on its website and social media. The video will be available on YouTube. Last year's winner was Heart of America founder Mike Whalen, developer of Hyatt Place in Altoona. The award is sponsored by WoodRiver Energy.

From the release sent to local media, "Recognizing the need to save this historic site, the Amana Society made the bold decision to transform the mill complex into a boutique hotel. . . . As part of the Hotel Millwright campus urban conservation project, the hotel worked with the Iowa Valley Resource Conservation and Development and Trees Forever to install eco-friendly features. Permeable pavers, native (plant) landscaping and a bio-retention cell were added to manage stormwater runoff and protect the local watershed. . . . The hotel is powered partly by green electricity from the Amana Farm's methane digester which turns a methane from cattle manure into renewable energy. This system reduces the hotel's carbon footprint and supports local renewable energy efforts."

The award recognition continues, "By blending the past with the future, Hotel Millwright has created a sustainable hospitality experience that honors the heritage of the Amana Colonies and promotes environmental responsibility."

The video production team was at the hotel two weeks ago to shoot video footage.

for countless people, countless birthday cakes, and the list goes on and on.

I remember how often my father or my sister and I would bring someone home who stayed to eat. Mother never complained, and just added extra plates to the table.

We just took things for granted, including the letters that she would type us when we went to camp, and then college.

How did she do it? Often we would just leave, never offering to help clear up. It wasn't until we were in homes of our own that we realized that meals did not appear on the table by themselves, nor did the beds make themselves or laundry magically wash and fold itself.

Recently, I found a book about Anne Bronte whose mother died when she was still an infant. The same thing happened to my own mother. She was often told how wonderful her mother was. Luckily, she had aunts who helped to raise her, but becoming a wife and mother was another thing. Instead of going to college as she wanted, she was directed to stay at home and care for the family because her grandmother was then dying of throat cancer.

It was almost ten years later that my father came home from the navy, married her, and brought her to Homestead where she shared a house with her in-laws for over twenty years. From the very beginning, her father came every evening for supper, sitting at the head of the table. After the death of my Selzer Opa, my Oma sat at the opposite end of the table for each evening meal. Of course, every holiday the whole family was there and my mother did all of the cooking.

My mother was a wonder at the stove, washing machine, lawn mower and typewriter. She just did it ALL. She had her faults, but my sister and I never heard our parents quarrel. They were always a "united front."

I often wonder how life would have been different for her if she had gotten the college education that she desired, if she had had a chance to go off on her own and explore her own gifts.

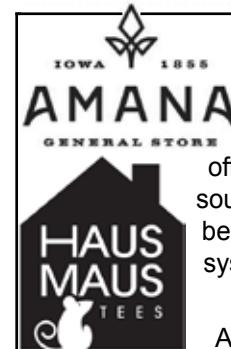

Notice is hereby given to the qualified electors of the Amana Colonies Land Use District in Iowa County, Iowa, that a special election will be held at the Middle Amana Fire Station, 2725 K St, Middle Amana, on Tuesday, October 1, 2024. Polls will open at Noon and close at 8:00 PM.

Pre-registered voters are required to provide an approved form of identification at the polling place before receiving and casting a regular ballot. Voters who are not pre-registered - such as voters registering to vote on election day - and voters changing precincts must also provide proof of residence. A voter who is unable to provide an approved form of identification (or prove residence if required) 1) may have the voter's identity/residence attested to by another registered voter in the precinct, 2) prove identity and residence using Election Day Registration documents, or 3) cast a provisional ballot and provide proof of identity/residence at the county auditor's office by 12:00 Noon on Thursday, October 3, 2024. Election Day Registrant attestors must provide an approved form of identification. For additional information about providing proof of identity and/or residence visit: https://sos.iowa.gov/voterid.

Voters can start in-office absentee voting beginning September 11, 2024 to September 30, 2024 from 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM. in the Iowa County Auditor's Office.
