DIANE'S HELPFUL HINTS

GROWING VEGETABLES

So many people have problems with blight on their tomatoes. I have found two things that could eliminate blight from your garden. Consistency in keeping your garden moist. A 1" layer of mushroom compost will help hold in the moisture for your plants. Nutrition! Add 1-2 ice cream buckets full of mushroom compost to each plant. For a tomato,







dig your hole, as deep as the tomato plant. Work in 1-2 ice cream buckets full of mushroom compost. Than plant your tomato plant deep – leave a couple of inches above ground. The whole stem will form roots. The mushroom compost will add beneficial bacteria into the soil. This will choke out the bad bacteria, and create a healthier plant. I know this works! No need to add any other fertilizer for the season. You will be able to grow fewer plants, because the plants you have will produce more fruit! I don't like grass clippings for mulch. Especially, if you used weed and feed on your lawn.

Also, If you are using other compost, do you know what's in it? Is it composted lawn clippings? Full of herbicide? Please don't add it to the garden!



























AJUGA, BLACK SCALLOP (BUGLEWEED) Near black leaves with shocking violet-blue flowers in spring. Shade, Hgt. 3-6", Zone 4-10.

ALCEA, FIESTA TIME (HOLLYHOCK) A shorter hollyhock with stunning double two-toned pink flowers. Sun, Hgt. 2-3', Zone 2-9.

ALLIUM, MILLENNIUM (ORNAMENTAL ONION) A profusion of 2" bright rosy-purple in summer. Deer resistant. Sun, Hgt. 15-20", Zone 5-8.

ARALIA, SUN KING (JAPANESE SPIKENARD) A hardy tropical bright gold plant for the shade. Shade, Hgt. 3', Zone 3-9.

ASCLEPIAS, CINDERELLA (BUTTERFLY WEED) Clusters of soft pink flowers in summer. A must have for monarchs. Sun, Hgt. 42-60", Zone 3-9.

ASCLEPIAS, HELLO YELLOW (BUTTERFLY WEED) Yellow flowers in July. The leaves are a food source for monarch caterpillars. Easy to grow. Sun, Hgt. 20-24", Zone 3-9.

ASCLEPIAS, TUBEROSA (SILKWOOD) Blooms in summer. Brilliant orange flowers. Late to break dormancy. Full Sun, Hgt. 40", Zone 4.

ASTER, PURPLE Great fall color. Mix with mums and other asters. Long bloom time in fall. Full Sun, Hgt. 15, Zone 3.

ASTILBE, MIGHTY CHOCOLATE CHERRY A giant astilbe with clusters of cherry red flowers on chocolate red stems. Deer resistant. Shade, Hgt. 36-48", Zone 3-8.

BAPTISIA, AUSTRALIS (BLUE INDIGO) Indigo blue flowers in early summer. Long peapods turn black in fall. Sun, Hgt. 3-4', Zone 3-9.

BERGENIA, DRAGONFLY SAKURA (PIG SQUEAK) A profuse spring bloomer with double pink flowers. Foliage turns purple in fall. Shade, Hgt. 10-14", Zone 3-8.

BRUNNERA, DIANE'S GOLD (HEARTLEAF) Chartreuse leaves all summer. Sky blue flowers in spring. Deer resistant. Shade, Hgt. 12", Zone 4-9.

DIANE RECOMMENDS **MUSHROOM COMPOST**

Totally organic rich dark mixture of wheat straw, peat moss, cottonseed meal, gypsum, lime and

chicken litter. This combination is superior to other compost.

- Compost will keep the ground temperature cooler and help add moisture.
- ▶ Work in 2-3", layer when planting a new tree, add a 2 gallon bucket full.
- Add a 2", layer to large (whiskey barrel size) containers.

Add a 5 qt. ice cream bucket full/vegetable plant.

- Top dress all containers, existing flower beds and trees.
- Add a 1 gallon bucket of mushroom compost/perennial.
- The end of June (after soil temps heat up) mulch each vegetable plant with a 1", layer of mushroom compost.

BRUNNERA, JACK FROST (HEARTLEAF) Sky blue flowers in spring. Great looking plant. Awesome foliage. Part to Full Shade, Hgt. 9-12", Zone 3-9.

CIMICIFUGA, HILLSIDE BLACK BEAUTY (SNAKEROOT) Striking dark purplish-black foliage. 12" long bottlebrush flowers in late summer. Shade, Hgt 3-4', Zone 4-8.

COREOPSIS, MOONBEAM AND ZAGREB (TICKSEED) Many yellow flowers in summer. Excellent performer. Full Sun, Hgt. 15", Zone 4-9.

DELPHINIUM, DELPHINA DARK BLUE A dwarf delphinium. Showy spikes of dark blue flowers in summer. No staking!. Sun or part sun, Hgt 18-20", Zone 3-9.

DICENTRA, SPECTABLIS (BLEEDING HEART) Chains of pink hearts. An old time favorite. Great spring time bloomer. Sun or Shade, Hgt. 30", Zone 3-9.

ECHINACEA, ALOHA (CONEFLOWER) Melon yellow petals with orange cones. Blooms summer until frost. Butterfly magnet. Sun, Hgt 32", Zone 4-9.

ECHINACEA, BIG KAHUNA (CONEFLOWER) A showstopper color in your garden. Honey mango flowers on sturdy stems. Sun, Hgt 27", Zone 4-9.

ECHINACEA, BUTTERFLY APRICOT (CONEFLOWER) Near pink center with coralorange edge. Blooms summer to frost. Sun, Hgt 18", Zone 4-9.

ECHINACEA, CHEYENNE SPIRIT (CONEFLOWER) Incredible color range of red, orange, yellow. First year flowering. Deer resistant. Sun, Hgt. 22-30", Zone 4-9.

ECHINACEA, CORAL CRAZE (CONEFLOWER) Large 5" coral pink flowers in summer. Echinaceas are a must have for color. Deer resistant. Sun, Hgt. 26-28", Zone 4-8.

ECHINACEA, DOUBLE SCOOP CRANBERRY (CONEFLOWER) Double cranberry red flowers. Sturdy and upright. Sun, Hgt 24", Zone 4-9.

ECHINACEA, KISMET RED (CONEFLOWER) Large red and early blooming. Reblooms all summer. Sun, Hgt 18", Zone 4-9.
















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



ECHINACEA, MELLOW YELLOW (CONEFLOWER) A variety of yellows!! From cream to lemon gold. Sun, Hgt 24", Zone 4-9.

ECHINACEA, MERLOT (CONEFLOWER) Large 5" rose pink flowers on strong stems. Many flowers/plant. Deer resistant. Sun, Hgt. 30", Zone 4-10.

ECHINACEA, ORANGE YOU AWESOME (CONEFLOWER) Orange with a reddish tint. Earlier to bloom. Sun, Hgt 20", Zone 4-9.

ECHINACEA, POW POW WILD BERRY (CONEFLOWER) Large 3-4" deep rose flowers in summer. Blooms all summer. Deer resistant. Sun, Hgt. 20-24", Zone 4-9.

ECHINACEA, SENSATION PINK (CONEFLOWER) Striking 3" magenta pink flowers on sturdy stems. Blooms all summer. Deer resistant. Sun, Hgt. 16-18", Zone 4-9.

EUPATORIUM, BABY JOE (SNAKEROOT) Purplish-red flowers Easy to grow. Great edition. Full to Part Sun, Hgt. 30", Zone 4-9.

EUPATORIUM, CHOCOLATE (JOE PYE WEED) Chocolate to deep purple leaves with purple stems. Starry white flowers in late summer. Sun, Hgt 40", Zone 4-8.

FERN, CRESTED SURG (ATHYRIUM) Japanese Painted Fern. Vigorous and good for a shady-moist garden. Shade, Hgt 20", Zone 3-8.

GAILLARDIA, ARIZONA SUN (BLANKET FLOWER) Large 3" fiery orange-red flowers in summer. Deadhead for continuous bloom. Deer resistant. Sun, Hgt. 8-10", Zone 3-10.

GERANIUM, ROZANNE (CRANESBILL) Perennial of the Year 2008 . Full to Part Sun, Hgt. 18-20', Zone 4-8.

GRASS, AUTUMN RED Plumes in mid-summer. An excellent grass for fall color. Full to Part Sun, Hgt. 5', Zone 4-9.



DIANE'S HELPFUL HINTS CARING FOR PERENNIALS

Why do plants die or why don't they thrive? The answer is simple – watering and/or nutrition, and quality of the plant from the beginning. NUTRITION: I mention mushroom compost all the time. Why? Because I know it works. Add at least 1 gallon of mushroom compost/perennial. More if you have poor soil. You are adding the good bacteria the plant needs to thrive. Also, the compost will help hold moisture and will break up clay soil and add substance to sandy soil.

WATER: I hear it all the time, "I watered, watered, watered." Then you didn't water correctly, if your plant did not thrive. A newly planted perennial will need about 5 gallons/week during a dry spell. A newly planted tree will need 20 gallons/week. Things have been extreme the last couple of summers, don't be afraid to give your plant water! Giving your plant, a shot of water every day, is not enough! Deep watering is the way to go. That's where 1-3" of mushroom compost will help each plant, retain moisture and give it amazing benefits.





GRASS, ELIJAH BLUE The best blue grass. Forms a dense mound. Sun to Shade, Hgt. 10", Zone 4-8.

GRASS, INDIAN WARRIOR (ANDROPOGON) Big Bluestem – A tall upright grass of green foliage that turns red to smoky purple mid-summer. Sun, Hgt. 5-6', Zone 3-9.

GRASS, KARL (CALAMAGROSTIS) Feather Reed Grass Compact and upright. Wheat like seed heads in summer. Most popular. Sun, Hgt. 4', Zone 4-8.

GRASS, OKTOBERFEST Great fall color. Leaves turn deep purple and red in early fall. Sun, Hgt. 6-7', Zone 5-9.

GRASS, SMOKE SIGNALS Little bluestem. Scarlet red tones in late summer. One of my favorite. Deer resistant. Sun, Hgt. 3-4', Zone 3-9.

HELIANTHUS, AUTUMN GOLD (WILLOWLEAF SUNFLOWER) A dwarf form of helianthus. Golden yellow daisy flowers completely cover this plant in late summer. Sun, Hgt 24", Zone 4-9.

HELLEBORUS, ROME IN RED (LENTEN ROSE) 3-4" Single rich wine red flowers in spring. Part Sun, Hgt 18", Zone 4-9.

HEMEROCALLIS, BELA LUGOSI (DAYLILY) One of the best purple daylilies. True purple with yellow center. Heavily budded. Rabbit resistant. Sun, Hgt. 33", Zone 3 – 9.

HEMEROCALLIS, DOUBLE PARDON ME (DAYLILY) A double red daylily! Reblooming. Sun, Hgt 18", Zone 3-9.

HEMEROCALLIS, HUNGRY EYES (DAYLILY) An attention getter! 5" mauve rose flowers with a tint of orange and wine red eye. Rebloomer. Sun, Hgt 22", Zone 3-9.

HEMEROCALLIS, LAVENDER BLUE BABY (DAYLILY) Large pink flowers all summer until frost. Deer resistant. Sun, Hgt. 28", Zone 3-9.

HEMEROCALLIS, RED HOT RETURNS (DAYLILY) A continuous red blooming daylily. Vigorous grower. Blooms all summer. Rabbit Resistant. Sun, Hgt. 24-28", Zone 3-9.

HEMEROCALLIS, STELLA D'ORO (DAYLILY) Blooms all season long. Most popular daylily. Re-bloomer. Full Sun, Hgt. 15", Zone 2-9.

HEMEROCALLIS, SUN DRIED TOMATOES (DAYLILY) An outstanding red daylily. Large, rich and sunfast. Sun, Hgt 32-36", Zone 3-9.

HEUCHERA, CHERRY TRUFFLES (CORAL BELLS) Leaves are bright red, turning to a rich mahogany in fall. Light pink flowers in summer. Deer resistant. Sun to part sun, Hgt. 10", Zone 4-9.

HEUCHERA, FIRE ALARM (CORAL BELLS) A great red coral bell. Fiery red in spring and fall. Pink flowers in summer. Sun, Hgt. 9-13", Zone 4-9.

HEUCHERA, GRANDE AMETHYST (CORAL BELLS) A fast growing coral bells. Gigantic wavy purple leaves. Sun or part sun, Hgt 14", Zone 4-9.

HEUCHERA, **PAPRIKA (CORAL BELLS)** Wow! Cherry-cola foliage. Do not cut back for winter. Loved by hummingbirds/butterflies. Sun or shade, Hgt. 8-16", Zone 4-9.

HEUCHERA, SILVER GUMDROP (CORAL BELLS) Silver, iridescent leaves with a semi gloss finish. Vibrant pink flowers in summer. Deer resistant. Sun to part sun, Hgt. 8", Zone 4-9.

HEUCHERA, TIMELESS GLOW(CORAL BELLS) Chartreuse yellow foliage adds a brightness to shade. Shade , Hgt 10", Zone 4-9.

HEUCHERA, TIMELESS TREASURE (CORAL BELLS) Pewter colored leaves with large rosy flowers. Sun or Shade, Hgt 10", Zone 4-9.

HIBISCUS, CHERRY CHOCO (ROSE MALLOW) Very large 8-9" dinnerplate flowers. White with intense pink veining. . Sun, Hgt 4', Zone 4-9.

HIBISCUS, CRANBERRY CRUSH (ROSE MALLOW) Deep scarlet red flowers. Maple like leaves. Blooms late summer. Sun, Hgt 4-5', Zone 4-9.

HIBISCUS, EVENING ROSE ((ROSE MALLOW) 8" hot pink flowers with near black foliage in late summer. Sun, Hgt 4', Zone 4-9.


HIBISCUS, HOLY GRAIL (ROSE MALLOW) Incredibly dark, near black leaves with 8-9" intense red flowers. Sun, Hgt 4-5', Zone 4-9.

HIBISCUS, MIDNIGHT MARVEL (ROSE MALLOW) Absolutely stunning! 8-9" deep wine-purple flowers. Very long blooming. Deer resistant. Sun, Hgt. 4', Zone 4-9.

DIANE'S HELPFUL HINTS

CREATING A HANGING BASKET

- Start with good quality potting soil we use PRO MIX
- Use top guality plants not all plants are created equal. At Diane's Greenhouse we give our plants the best care they can get. We use the best potting soil, they are watered when they need it and they are fed! So when our plants get to your house, they are ready to explode.



- After I trimmed it, I added 3 Tbs. of Proven Winner slow release. And I fertilized with "Nature's Source" (formerly known as Daniels), daily all through the summer.
- I water my baskets daily on a drip system.

HOSTA, AUTUMN FROST-PROVEN WINNER 2020 Proven Winner Hosta of the Year. Frosty blue-green leaves with yellow margins. Light lavender flowers. Shade, Hgt. 12-16", 7one 3-9

HOSTA, CAPTAIN KIRK Dark green edges with bright gold center. Pale lavender flowers. Shade, Hgt 20", Zone 3-9.

HOSTA, COOL AS A CUCUMBER A vigorous hosta with bright green edges. Creamy white center. Shade, Hgt 28", Zone 3-9.

HOSTA, DESIGNER GENES Best yellow hosta with red petioles. Red scapes carry purple flowers. Shade, Hgt 18", Zone 3-9.

HOSTA, DREAM WEAVER Premium hosta. Large blue/green leaves. White flowers in summer. Shade to Part Shade, Hgt. 30", Zone 3-9.

HOSTA, ETCHED GLASS Shadowland Proven Winner hosta. Wide dark green edges with bright yellow center, white flowers. Sun, Hgt. 18", Zone 3-9.

HOSTA, HAPPY DAYZ Blue green foliage with yellow centers. Lavender flowers. Shade, Hgt. 18-32", Zone 3-9.

HOSTA, HUDSON BAY Wide, bright blue edges with apple green and creamy white centers. Near white flowers. Shade to Part Shade, Hgt. 24", Zone 3-9.

HOSTA, PRAIRIE'S EDGE Bright yellow center with dark green margins. Lavender flowers. Shade, Hgt. 18", Zone 3-9.

HOSTA, SEDUCER Shadowland Proven Winner hosta. Large dark green leaves with gold margin. Near white flowers. Shade, Hgt. 26", Zone 3-9.

LIATRIS, KOBOLD (BLAZING STAR) Rose/lavender flower spikes Blooms in summer. Full Sun, Hgt. 2', Zone 3-9.

LIGULARIA, BOTTLE ROCKET (GOLDEN RAY) Thick, serrated, green leaves with mustard flower spikes in summer. Holds up well in summer heat. Shade, Hgt. 28-34", Zone 4-9.

MALVA, ZEBRINA (MALLOW) Blooms in early summer. Heat and drought tolerant. Full Sun, Hgt. 36", Zone 4-8.

MONARDA, CHERRY POPS (BEE BALM) Sugar Buzz series. Cherry red flowers. Mildew resistant. A great flower. Deer resistant. Sun, Hgt. 20", Zone 4-8.



MONARDA, GRAPE GUMBALL (BEE BALM) Sugar Buzz series. Vibrant magenta flowers. Mildew resistant. Deer Resistant. Sun, Hgt. 20-24", Zone 4-9.

MONARDA, PARDON MY PURPLE (BEE BALM) Proven Winner. A Dwarf form of bee balm. Fuchsia-purple flowers. Mildew resistant. Deer resistant. Sun, Hgt. 10-12", Zone 4-9.

MONARDA, ROCKIN RASPBERRY (BEE BALM) Deep raspberry flowers in summer. Rabbit resistant. Loved by hummingbirds/ butterflies. Sun, Hgt. 20", Zone 4-8.

NEPETA, CAT'S MEOW (CATMINT) Proven Winner. This catmint keeps it neat appearance. Long blooming. Rabbit and deer resistant. Sun, Hgt. 17-20". Zone 3-8.

NEPETA, WALKER'S LOW (CATMINT) Perennial of the Year 2007. Soft lavender flowers. Full Sun, Hgt. 2-3', Zone 3-8.

PAPAVER, CHAMPAGNE BUBLES SCARLET (POPPY) Tons of cheerful red flowers in spring. . Sun, Hgt 12", Zone 3-8.

PENSTEMON, MIDNIGHT MASQUERADE (BEARDTONGUE) Dark foliage with lavender purple flowers with white interiors. Very long blooming. Sun, Hgt 36", Zone 3-8.

PHLOX, BAMBINI SWEET TART (GARDEN PHLOX) Large pink flower heads. Easy to grow and dependable. Sun, Hgt 12", Zone 4-8.

PHLOX, DAVID (GARDEN PHLOX) Exceptionally large white heads of flowers in summer. Mildew resistant. Very fragrant. Sun, Hgt. 36-42", Zone 4-8.

PHLOX, FLAME PURPLE (GARDEN PHLOX) Large clusters of purple flowers in summer. Mildew resistant. Deer resistant. Sun, Hgt. 16", Zone 4-8.

DIANE'S HELPFUL HINTS CHOOSE DEER RESISTANT PERENNIALS

These plants are known to be less appealing to deer. Deer may ignore certain plants one year and munch away on them the following year.

PHLOX, FLAME WHITE EYE (GARDEN PHLOX) White flowers with a red eye. Very striking in the garden. Fragrant. Deer resistant. Sun, Hgt. 16", Zone 4-8.

PULMONARIA, RASPBERRY SPLASH (LUNGWORT) Raspberry pink flowers age to lilac purple in spring. Spotted foliage all season. Deer/rabbit resistant. Shade, Hgt. 10-12", Zone 3-9.

RUDBECKIA, AMERICAN GOLD RUSH (BLACK EYED SUSAN) A breakthrough because of it's disease resistance. A dome of yellow flowers in summer. Deer resistant. Sun, Hgt. 20-24", Zone 3-9.

RUSSIAN SAGE, ATRIPLICIFOLIA Blooms late summer. Airy lavender blue. Full Sun, Hgt. 36", Zone 4-9.

RUSSIAN SAGE, DENIM N LACE One of my favorite plants. Compact and upright. Bright sky blue flowers in summer. Deer resistant. Sun, Hgt. 28-32", Zone 4-9.

SALVIA, CARADONNA (MEADOW SAGE) Deep violet blue spikes in spring into summer. Looks good with coreopsis. Easy to grow. Sun, Hgt. 18, Zone 4-9.

SALVIA, MAY NIGHT (MEADOW SAGE) Perennial of the Year 1997. Blooms early summer. Full Sun, Hgt. 14-18", Zone 3-8.

SALVIA, MIDNIGHT MODEL Striking violet blue flowers. Prune and it will rebloom. Sun, Hgt 22", Zone 3-8.

SEDUM, AUTUMN FIRE (STONECROP) Pink to bronze flowers Blooms late summer. Out performs other sedums. Full Sun, Hgt. 24", Zone 3-9.

SEDUM, DREAM DAZZLER Sun Sparkler. Spring foliage emerges pink, white and purple. Masses of magenta pink flowers in fall. Sun, Hgt. 15", Zone 4-9.

SEDUM, PLUM DAZZLED (STONECROP) Hardy groundcover. Dark plum-purple foliage all summer. Pink flowers in fall. Sun, Hgt. 6", Zone 4-9.

SEDUM, ROCK N GROW BOOGI WOOGI Yellow flowers in summer. Groundcover and variegated foliage . Sun, Hgt 6", Zone 3-9.












ROSES

ROSES LOVE FERTILIZER

Roses can give so much color and scent on one plant! Your roses will perform better if you give them a deep watering once a week. Even established plants need water. And roses love fertilizer! Prune off the old blooms-so they keep on blooming.

Prune your roses about 12-24" from the ground in the fall or early spring. Roses also love sun. And they will benefit from a 3-4" layer of mulch.









SWFFT

SEDUM, WILDFIRE (STONECROP) Red leaves, edged with hot pink. Turns pumpkin orange in the fall. Sun, Hgt. 6", Zone 4-9.

SEMPERVIVUM, GOLD NUGGET (HEN & CHICKS) Chick Charms. Bright gold foliage with red edges. Mature rosettes up to 5" across. Deer resistant. Sun, Hgt. 2", Zone 3-9.

SEMPERVIVUM (HEN AND CHICKS) Multi-color rosettes of baby "chicks", Takes drought well. Use on roofs. Full Sun, Hgt. Groundcover, Zone 4.


STACHYS, HUMMELO (BETONY) Lamb's ear is its cousin. A very hardy, showy, flowering lamb's ear. Bushy pink flower spikes in summer. Sun, Hgt. 18-20", Zone 4-8.

TRADESCANTIA, RED CLOUD (SPIDER) Rose/purple flowers for 8 weeks in summer. No need to deadhead. Shade, Hgt. 36 or 15-18", Zone 3-9.

TRADESCANTIA, SWEET KATE (SPIDERWORT) A gold foliage. Even pretty when not in bloom. Purple flowers. Sun or Shade, Hgt 16'', Zone 3-9.

VERONICA, WIZ OF AHHS Magic Show series. Thick spikes of violet blue flowers in early summer. Sun, Hgt. 14-16", Zone 4-8.

YUCCA, COLOR GUARD (ADAMS NEEDLE) Variegated foliage with white flower spikes that bloom in summer. Sun, Hgt 3-4', Zone 4-10.

DIANE'S HELPFUL HINTS TREES & SHRUBS

Trees require 20 gallons of water/week

Shrubs require 10 gallons/week

- Add a gallon bucket of mushroom compost to each vegetable plant. Also, mulch With a 3", layer. You'll be amazed with the results. Less disease and more fruit!
- When planting a new tree, cover the trunk with a white, Perforated tree protector. This will protect the tree for the winter, and against rabbits. Leave on all year, until the tree forms it's real bark.
- When you purchase a tree or shrub, be sure to water the container every day. The tree or shrub must get planted wet! If it's a hot windy day, water the container first, dig your hole and plant your item. Water the tree or shrub thoroughly. Keep the root ball of the tree or shrub moist. It helps to mulch your tree, to keep the moisture in the ground. We also recommend to incorporate one package of Soil Moist in the soil at time of planting. Most problems come from under watering or over watering.
- Always plant a tree 2" above ground including mulch
