A gift can take many shapes. Sometimes it is exactly what is needed exactly when it is needed. Sometimes we don't recognize it as a gift when it is given but learn to appreciate it later. And sometimes, it's a rock.

Let me explain.

Our youngest grandchild is a precocious 6-year-old who moves so quickly and stealthily that she can't be tracked with radar. In addition to being a marvel of perpetual motion, she is funny, and generous. She has given us several pictures, shown me how to make paper flowers and how to fly paper airplanes (which we find all over the house after she is gone), helped Grandpa make Baked Ziti, and given us rocks.

She just placed them near the picture of Brian and I, and let us find the surprise ourselves.

It makes me smile.

I love the other items that I carefully placed on those shelves, but I confess, my favorites are now the plain little rocks that will outshine any work of art we could find or make, because they were thoughtfully collected, lovingly presented, and tenderly placed, all for our happiness. I think it would be a sin not to be happy about that.

I see these precious gifts every day and am reminded of the gifts we receive from God. God's gifts are just as thoughtfully, lovingly and tenderly given, although they may not seem like gifts at first. They may be simple gifts that elude our notice, gifts of people who have need, or resources we can share, or even God's presence in hard times. These are the gifts that may slip by us if we are not paying attention.

Where are the rocks in your life? Where are the surprise gifts hidden among the simple rocks? How has God showered you with an abundance of gifts that are scattered across your life? Our love for God calls us to count it all a blessing, and treasure each gift as if it were the stuff of life.

Movie Night at Rinn

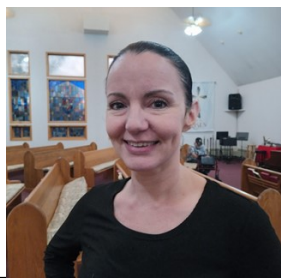

- A sign-up sheet will be at the podium in the Narthex each Sunday.

Noah's Community Outreach

You PROBABLY know Noah's Community Outreach collects clothing and hygiene items throughout the year, to distribute (in backpacks) to people in our community who are unhoused. Right now we are prepping for winter, buying sleeping bags and watching for sales on warm clothing, socks, etc. Last year we distributed 37-ish backpacks; this coming year we hope to distribute 50 or more.

You MAY know Noah's Community Outreach provides Saturday night supper, twice a month, for people who stay overnight in the Hope for Longmont shelter (usually about 30 guests).

You MAY NOT know - we are now partnering with Hope for Longmont to provide lunches throughout the week. Hope for Longmont serves 300 lunches each month at their food bank location, and another 100 as their outreach team meets people around town who need and will accept support. Each week, we provide supplies like sandwiches, snacks, drinks, and fruit for them to distribute. This week we took them some hard-boiled eggs! We by no means meet the entire need, but we are helping.

Noah's Community Outreach receives some grant funding from Rinn UMC, and is also supported by donations in time, resources, and \$ from the congregation.


