Greetings to All,

March 16th is getting closer by the day. March 16th thru March 18th, is our Florida District Rally. We are looking forward to a great time with **FUN** friends. We will be having on-bike riding games in the parking lot, for both 2-wheel and 3-wheel motorcycles. Solo or pairs riders can participate.

YOU AND YOUR MOTORCYCLE SKILL LEVEL

It is an unfortunate fact that many motorcyclists are involved in crashes. In almost a third of them, the rider took no evasive action to avoid the crash or did so too late to avoid them. This statistic comes from a recent National Transportation Safety Board report on the causes of motorcycle crashes.

Rider education and on-road experiences stress the need for motorcyclists to pay strict attention to the road ahead and do their best to avoid dangerous situations before they occur. But motorcyclists are human, and distractions and/or a lack of riding skills can and do rear their ugly heads on occasion.

So, what can be done to help a motorcyclist reduce the chances of being involved in a crash? Let's start with "The Basic Riders Course." There are many things in that course to learn other than knowing how to physically maneuver a motorcycle. Knowing how you as a human react to different situations, as well as how your motorcycle will react, is very helpful in saving you some grief. Many riders, like me, were self taught on how to ride, which may have included being taught by an untrained rider. How do you know the information you are being given by that

untrained person is correct? I was self taught to ride a motorcycle 28 years before I became a Motorcycle Instructor. When I went to Instructor's School, I found out there were things I had been doing wrong and things I didn't know. I had a few mishaps on my bikes during my first 28 years of riding that could have been avoided had I first been given the proper instruction. I have been a MSF (Motorcycle Safety Foundation) Instructor now for 26 years, which has been very beneficial to me as well as the riders I have trained.

Another thing that can help a seasoned rider is to take a one-day motorcycle refresher course. Physical skills perish with time. You might say: "I ride all the time so I don't need any refresher course." The physical skills that perish over time are not the casual everyday riding skills. It is the emergency maneuvers that you don't usually get a chance to practice. It is too late to find out during an emergency that you cannot react properly. The riding skills you must stay proficient in are: Emergency Braking, Swerving and Cornering. These are the type of exercises you will practice in a one-day riding course. What better place to practice these

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skills than on an empty safe parking lot. It is better to see how well you react in a simulated situation with nothing to hit, rather than to improperly react in real traffic and slam into a car.

For the older riders, the benefit of taking a refresher course is self assessment. See if you can still properly handle the machine you are riding. You might find you do not still possess the physical strength to control the bike you are on. You might realize that your current bike is now too heavy to hold up during

stops. You might decide to go to a lighter bike or even to a three-wheel motorcycle so you can continue to safely ride.

Two-wheel and Trike Riding Classes are available. We teach the Two-wheel and Trike one-day refresher courses. These classes will be approximately 6 hours in length depending on the number of participants. You could also schedule a PLP (Parking Lot Practice) session. PLP's are usually only a couple of hours. You do not need a certified riding instructor to conduct a PLP. We have diagrams for the PLP exercises we would be glad to send you

upon request. We could also travel to your location for a PLP to assist you. You can utilize a parking lot of your chose as long as you have permission from the owner of the parking lot to do so. Your group could also meet us at one of our approved MSF sites for a PLP session. So, consider taking a one-day refresher Riding Course or a PLP for your safety as well as the safety of the loved one riding with you.

We are here to assist you with your training needs.

5 AMAZING FACTS ABOUT THE HUMAN HEART.

The blood vessels in your heart are the most likely to clog.

The reasons: Blood flows in two directions in many arteries, creating turbulence that can damage artery walls – which makes it easier for plaque to set in. And coronary arteries have lots of branches and bends, which are prime real estate for arteriosclerosis.

Nearly half of all heart attacks have no symptoms.

According to a 2016 Wake Forest University study, no-symptom attacks were more common in men but deadlier in woman.

The best food for your heart? It might be bananas.

In a 2020 analysis of studies involving more than 4 million people, bananas were associated with 24 percent lower risk for coronary heart disease. But all produce helps; people who munched the most fruit and vegetables had 11 percent less cardiovascular disease than those who ate the least.

Spare parts for your heart may come from outer space.

In 2020 NASA blasted cardiac stem cells into space for an Emory University study seeking to find out whether they would become beating heart muscle cells faster in zero-gravity conditions. The stem cells became heart cells in just three weeks. Researchers hope to use them for heart failure repairs, a therapy that could require up to 150 million cells per treatment.

A great sport for your heart? Grab a racket.

A study that tracked 80,306 adults for nine years found that tennis and badminton cut risk for fatal cardiovascular disease by 59 percent. Swimming and aerobics lowered the odds by 41 and 36 percent, respectively. Distance running was less effective; some research suggests it could have a negative impact.

At least I don't have to worry about running for exercise. Swimming sounds good!

Valentine's Day

The exchange of Valentine's Day cards with declarations of love goes back to the 1500s, with people making their own handmade cards, often decorating them with ribbons and lace. In the late 1700s, romantic cards started being commercialized, and they usually depicted the image of the god of love, Cupid, and hearts, images that still prevail on this day, as symbols of Valentine's day.

Some things never change. Here are some motorcycle accident-cause factors that have

unfortunately survived the test of time and some mitigating factors that are worth considering.

Generally, motorcyclist speed was too fast for the conditions (traffic, road, weather, rider capabilities, etc). Slow down!

Specifically, motorcyclist failed to negotiate a curve due to excessive entry speed. Slow down! The first step in the Motorcycle Safety Foundation guidance for negotiating curves is slow down!

An on-coming vehicle turned left in front of the motorcyclist, usually at an intersection. The on-coming vehicle driver claims to have not seen the motorcycle. Increase your vigilance at intersections! Increase

your and your bike's conspicuity all the time. Consider adding a modulating headlight. Use high beams and fog or running lights in daylight. Wear high-vis clothing.

Motorcyclist was in the other vehicle's blind spot. Be aware of your neighbor's blind spots and seek to stay out of them.

The other vehicle was in the motorcyclist's blind spot. Don't let another vehicle stay in your blind spot. Slow down or speed up. Eliminate your blind spots. Turn your head!

Motorcyclist was alcohol- or drug-impaired. Don't!

trikes, and accessories are very easy to find and install. For those who ride other types, light up your bike and make yourself more visible by not wearing dark clothing. We owe it to ourselves to employ every advantage we can to arrive home at the end of our ride safely.

During the zoom meetings held last month, we discussed the lack of some sort of award for members who excel at sharing the Motorist Awareness materials and messaging, however, we are working on creating one and the process to earn one. They won't be available at this year's rally, but will be soon.

We hope to see everybody at the rally and share in the **FUN!!!**
