REACH of Cherokee and Graham County, Inc. is an outreach program for victims of domestic violence.

As the staff travel to the schools to discuss domestic violence, they have identified a need for children's shoes, underwear, and socks of varying sizes. They have also adopted some families to help as well. **Teens frequently request a fleece blanket.** If you have items of clothing (clean and in good condition), children's books, etc. to donate please place them in the blue bin located in the pantry. Check out the clearance section at Walmart next time you go shopping.

Stacy can always use some **small tote bags** and small travel size items to fill them with, e.g. travel size shampoo and conditioner, toothbrushes, tooth paste, travel size deodorant, hand sanitizer,etc.

Please contact the REACH office staff if you have furniture you want to donate to arrange pickup by the Thrift Store volunteers. They also ask for cooking utensils to help victims start over. Often the victims leave home with only the clothes on their back, so they are given clothes, furniture, and items for the home from the Thrift Store until they can get back on their feet. They also can use items to help with their selfesteem and pass the time until they can be placed in a safe environment. You can provide puzzles (500 pieces or less), adult coloring books, reading material, word puzzles, make -up, nail polish, hair clips, etc.

837-2097 or 828-837-8064 for more information. Local REACH covers Cherokee and Graham County.

REACH is leading our community in eliminating domestic violence and sexual assault through education, advocacy, self-empowerment, and community awareness.

FOOD BANK DONATIONS

We need your help to keep our pantry stocked. If no family, or individual has made a special request; then, Lula pulls items off the shelves and takes them to the Cherokee County Food Bank, Inc. in Andrews, NC. The food bank is open to the public on Tuesdays and Saturdays from 10-12.

Suggested items based on Lula's discussion with some of the female staff: they can always use feminine hygiene products and other personal hygiene items, e.g. toothpaste, toothbrushes, bars of soap, wipes, small bottles of shampoo, soups that can be heated over a small fire, small jars of peanut butter and items that do not require a stove for cooking. Most of the clients are homeless and/or senior citizens living on a fixed income, so they can use small bottles of laundry detergent and Clorox to wash their clothes. The food bank has a bakery that donates bread, and the local Walmart provides fresh produce.

You can also write a check payable to the Andrews Food Bank, P. O. Box 843, Andrews, NC 28901, and they will supplement items that are not being donated.

The Laying on of Hands

In the Book of Genesis, the laying on of hands primarily signifies the transfer of blessing, authority, and identification. It's a symbolic act where physical touch conveys divine favor or assigns responsibility. Examples include Jacob blessing his grandsons, and Aaron transferring sin onto a scapegoat.

Here's a more detailed explanation:

Blessing:

In Genesis 48:14-15, Jacob lays his hands on Ephraim and Manasseh, Joseph's sons, to bless them, signifying the transfer of divine favor. This act is a physical demonstration of God's blessing being passed down through the generations.

Authority:

While not explicitly stated in Genesis, the laying on of hands is later associated with the transfer of authority in other parts of the Bible, like Moses appointing Joshua as his successor. This idea is rooted in the Genesis narrative of blessings and inheritance.

Identification:

In <u>Leviticus</u> 16:21, Aaron lays his hands on the scapegoat, symbolically transferring the sins of the people onto the animal. This illustrates how laying on of hands can also represent the transfer of something negative, like sin, in the context of the sacrificial system.

It's Way 700 Hot!

Do you know the difference between a heat stroke and heat exhaustion?

As North Carolina faces an intense heatwave, Duke Energy is calling on residents to conserve electricity during peak afternoon hours to alleviate pressure on the power grid.

North Carolina is still experiencing extreme heat this week in the 90s which will take a toll on HVAC systems and the power grid across the county.

Heat Stroke

- Extremely high body temperature: A core body temperature of 103°F (40°C) or higher is a key indicator.
- Altered mental state: This can range from confusion, disorientation, and slurred speech to seizures, loss of consciousness, and coma.
- Skin changes: Skin may be hot, red, and dry (or sometimes profuse sweating).
- Rapid pulse: The heart will beat faster to try and cool the body down.
- Other symptoms: Headache, dizziness, nausea, vomiting, and rapid, shallow breathing can also occur.
- Lack of sweating: Contrary to what some may expect, heat stroke may be accompanied by a lack of sweating.

If you suspect heat stroke, it is crucial to seek immediate medical attention by calling 911 or the local emergency number.

Heat Exhaustion

- Heat exhaustion can precede heat stroke: Recognize the symptoms of heat exhaustion (fatigue, nausea, headache, dizziness) and take steps to cool down and rehydrate to prevent progression to heat stroke.
- Be aware of risk factors: Physical activity in hot weather, wearing heavy clothing, alcohol consumption, and inadequate fluid intake can increase the risk of heat stroke.
