



Justice and Accountability in Remembering George Floyd Statement from the Baptist General Convention of Virginia Commission on Social Justice

As iron sharpens iron, so one person sharpens another. (Proverbs 27:17)

On Tuesday, the 4th Judicial District in the State of Minnesota found former police officer Derrick Chauvin guilty in the death of George Floyd. Chauvin's verdict included being found guilty of second-degree unintentional murder, third-degree murder, and second-degree manslaughter. Many of you have prayed for change in being able to live without fear and live with unity and peace. We reflect on this verdict as a need for change and a need for accountability. This moment is not truly a celebration, but more a sample of joy. Our few hours of hope, where we tasted the sweet joy of the morning, became the bitter taste of tears as time reversed to the night of weeping in the death of Ma'Khia Bryant in Columbus, Ohio.

Justice would have been George Floyd living to see his 50th birthday or watching his youngest child and grandchildren grow up. We must pull back the curtain of injustice and fight for what happened during the trial: accountability. We point to the jury as the place of accountability, but the real accountability was the officers speaking up during the trial. Proverbs 27:17 is used in many of our congregations as a text for mentoring, but it is more about accountability.

It is time for our churches to push the call for justice and greater accountability in law makers (legislative branch), law enforcers (executive branch), and law interpreters (judicial branch). The time is now for us to push for internal accountability, where the true quest for justice is in the spirit of speaking up. We encourage everyone to continue praying for all families affected by these tragic deaths and trials, as we look not only to sentencing, but also to how we can create a more just system of law enforcement and governing. Where that begins is with your local community.



COVID-19 Funeral Assistance



The COVID-19 pandemic has brought overwhelming grief to many families. At FEMA, our mission is to help people before, during and after disasters. We are dedicated to helping ease some of the financial stress and burden caused by the virus.

Under the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act of 2021 and the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, FEMA will provide financial assistance for COVID-19-related funeral expenses incurred after January 20, 2020.

Forward Virginia: Guidelines

Religious Services

How do the gathering restrictions apply to religious services?

There is not a limit to the number of participants who can attend a religious service. However, if the religious service has more than 50 individuals indoors and 100 individuals outdoors, the service is subject to the distancing, cleaning, and signage requirements found in section I, subsection B, paragraph 1(b) of Executive Order 72, which include, but are not limited to, seating parties a minimum of six feet apart and mandatory masks.

Any social gathering held in connection with a religious service (for example, a reception following a wedding) is not considered part of the religious service and is subject to the generally applicable ban on public and private in-person gatherings.

Virginians are encouraged to seek alternative means of attending religious services if possible, such as virtually or via "drive-through" worship.

Wearing a mask is mandatory for religious services. The exemption for "religious rituals" is intended to allow for practices, including but not limited to communion, where masks must be removed temporarily.

Religious services such as **wedding ceremonies and funeral rites** with more than 50 people indoors and 100 people outdoors may occur subject to the distancing, cleaning, and signage requirements, found in section I, subsection B, paragraph 1(b) of Executive Order 72.

Any social gathering held in connection with a religious service is subject to the generally applicable ban on public and private inperson gatherings.



What is drive-through worship? What about drive-in churches?

Attendees may travel to their place of wor-



ship, park in the parking lot and listen to the religious message while remaining in their vehicles. Participants must remain in their vehicle at all times, except as necessary to visit a restroom. Any interaction by the faith leaders and those in the vehicles must be strictly limited, such as using physical distancing methods when passing out palms, serving Holy Communion using sealed or self-contained elements, and priests directing congregants to place ashes or water on their own forehead as opposed to priests applying the ashes or water directly on the foreheads of the congregants. Any objects used for collecting monetary offerings shall not be passed from attendee to attendee but may be offered to attendees in a vehicle as long as the object stays in the possession of the person assisting with collection. Appropriate measures should be taken for the safety of those functioning outside of the cars. Faith communities should also adhere to any noise ordinances.

The Weatherization & Energy Efficiency Services Initiative


The Weatherization & Energy Efficiency Services initiative will provide an intergenerational skilled weatherization training series to enhance the Baptist General Convention of Virginia's and Rebuilding Together Richmond's engagement of non-profits, academic institutions, government agencies, businesses, and civic communities in providing weatherization services for 15 households in need. The initiative has three significant facets, namely (1) Weatherization & Energy Efficiency Workshops, (2) Weatherization & Energy Efficiency Coaches, and (3) Weatherization & Energy Efficiency Tune-Ups. Each facet is de-

signed to inform, to inspire, and to involve junior and high school students, disengaged young adults, college and graduate students, veterans, and selected clients who are seniors or have a disability.

end of the initiative to share additional information, conduct satisfaction surveys, and report on other improvements made on the home. The Coaches will also be available for public service announcements and conversations regarding the initiative and Dominion Energy's Share Programs. Coaches can allow the clients to speak to the benefits of both the Weatherization & Energy Efficiency Services and Dominion Energy Shared Programs.

(3) Weatherization & Energy Efficiency Tune-Ups will provide 15 low-income households—consisting of seniors, veterans, and persons with

disabilities—with weatherization and energy efficiency services. With the guidance from Energy Conservation Inc. (ECI), RTR's trusted weatherization partner with over forty years of experience, we will provide weatherization and energy efficiency recommendations and relevant upgrades. The purposes of the Tune-Ups are as



gy Efficiency Workshops will be developed virtually and shared through the ZOOM video conferencing platform. We will invite Dominion Energy's contractors, employees, and retirees to serve as instructors for the virtual Workshops and leaders of the Tune-Ups. When in-person gatherings are safe, programming will be held at the Baptist General Convention of Virginia and the Children's Home of Virginia Baptists, which will provide its facility and buildings as learning labs for the program.

Each workshop must be created and formatted for the various age groups/audiences by the staff and the consultants. There will be a curriculum for the areas of weatherization, energy efficiency, volunteering, the role of the coaches, and related disciplines. The instructors will teach life skills and provide hands-on experiences on practical weatherization, ecology, energy efficiency, and environmental justice.

Participants who complete the Workshops will have the opportunity to serve as a Coach to assist with performing Tune-Ups directed by RTR.

(2) Weatherization & Energy Efficiency Coaches will work with residents of the 15 assigned households to review utility bills and provide individualized, helpful tips to help them with cost savings. Each Coach will continue to follow the clients twice before the

follows:

- To reduce unnecessary energy consumptions,
- To reduce high energy costs,
- To reduce emissions that harm the environment, and
- To improve the living conditions of the home.

The Tune-Ups will be free of charge to each household. The exact services that each recipient receive may vary by home. Services may include but are not limited to, the following:

- Energy assessments
- Replacing incandescent lights with LED lights in high use areas
- Air vent and duct sealing
- Attic insulation
- Water-saving services
- Installation of energy-saving showerheads and high-efficiency faucet aerators
- Wrapping water heater and hot water pipes ENERGY STAR refrigerator replacement indoor air quality improvements

Coaches will assist with volunteer-friendly weatherization and energy-efficient services that can be conducted during the assessment.





Balance Forgiveness

If you are struggling due to the pandemic and have a balance on your Dominion Energy account greater than 30 days past due as of September

30th, that balance will be wiped clean.
